

Grand Junction, Colorado

November 17, 1941

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Treece, Robb, and President Campbell. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

An additional petition was filed signed by dealers in cigarettes requesting that the license fee be lowered to \$10.00. It was moved and seconded and duly carried that the petition be accepted and filed.

Councilman Boston then moved and Councilman Hoisington seconded the motion that the license fee for cigarettes be lowered to \$10.00 per year or portion thereof, and that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up an ordinance to that effect. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Carson, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Treece and Campbell. Councilmen voting NO - Ross. A majority of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

The balance of the meeting was devoted to the 1942 budget.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Carson that the 1942 budget be approved and adopted with the minor changes as agreed upon, as submitted. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and duly seconded that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
