Grand Junction, Colorado January 21, 1942

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Treece and President Campbell. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman, and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held January 7th were read and approved.

The matter of the renewal of the beer license for C. H. Patterson dba Owl Cigar Store was again brought up. Chief of Police Scott was present and gave a complete resume of the recent trouble at the Owl Cigar Store, when George Fiene had been killed by falling on the sidewalk in front of the store, just after being removed from the store because he was drunk and causing a disturbance. The Police Department stated in a letter that after a investigation, they could not find sufficient thorough justification to disapprove the application for the renewal of the license. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Robb that the license for the Owl Cigar Store be approved. Motion carried, with Councilman Ross voting No.

City Manager Brownson made a report on the matter of investing Water Department funds which cannot be used at this time to purchase materials for improving the water system. There is also \$5000.00 in sewer Department funds available for investment.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the City Treasurer be instructed to purchase \$5,000.00 in Paving District No. 47, 3% bonds with \$500.00 Sewer Department money. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was decided to postpone investment of the Water Funds until after the 1st of February.

City Manager Brownson read a letter from Mr. David Lawrence of Boettcher & Co. asking if the City would be interested in refunding the Special Assessment bonds. He was instructed to write to Mr. Lawrence and ascertain just what kind of a proposition could be made.

Bonds for James E. Broadhead and Jaros Electrical Co., electrical contractors, Preston H. Dean, Home Portrait Photographer, and A. R. Allison cement contractor, were presented, having been approved as to form by City Attorney Hinman. It was moved by Councilman Robb and seconded by Councilman Boston that the bonds be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

City Manager Brownson showed the Council the plans for the

new Airport.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
