Grand Junction, Colorado March 18, 1942

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Treece and President Campbell. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held on March 4th were read and approved.

An application for the renewal of the beer license for Jos. Moser at the Piggly Wiggly Store No. 2, 715 North 12th Street was presented. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the license be approved. Motion carried.

William Layden made an offer for the tax sale certificates against Lots 21 and 22, Block 89, located at 1140 Rood Ave. There are \$1,059.77 in taxes against this property and Mr. Layden offered \$900.00 for same. This amount does not include interest and penalties. The valuation of same is \$2,500.00 and the cost of clearing the title would be \$310.00. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the offer be rejected. Motion carried.

The final estimate for James A. Cox, contractor for Sidewalk District No. 11 was presented. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the matter of payment for the final estimate for Sidewalk District No. 11 be held over until the next regular meeting of the Council. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

Bonds for George L. Unfred, plumber and James A. Cox, cement contractor, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney, were presented. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the bonds be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

It was reported that City Treasurer Stringer had been seriously injured in an automobile wreck and was in the hospital in Moab, Utah, and would likely be unable to be in the office for some time. It was suggested that Mrs. Stringer assist with the work in the office during the time Mr. Stringer is unable to take care of same.

City Manager Brownson reported that Chief of Police Scott was leaving to accept a position at Hutchinson, Kansas. The Council suggested that Mr. Brownson consider some member of the present police force as a Chief of the Department.

It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by

Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
