

Grand Junction, Colorado
July 1, 1942

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Campbell and President Treece. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Hinman and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The minutes of the regular meeting held June 17th were read and approved.

C. E. Van Houten, 602 Hill Avenue made an application to extend a driveway six feet onto his property. This driveway is now an eight-foot one and serves two properties, which has not proven satisfactory. By enlarging it six feet on his side, it will give him sufficient room for his purpose. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the request be granted. Motion carried.

E. R. (Tony) Mason filed an application for a liquor license for the Avalon Cafe. He did not get this application in until late in the afternoon and the Police Department had no opportunity to make a report on same. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Ross that the application be tabled until the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried.

The merchants who have charge of the bond and stamp sale desire the use of the auditorium for a banquet on the last day of July. It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Carson that they be granted the use of the auditorium at cost. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

The following entitled emergency ordinance was read: "AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AIRPORT". City Manager Brownson read an estimate of the cost of moving the improvements and hangar. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the proposed emergency ordinance be passed and adopted, numbered 656 and published in the Daily Sentinel on July 2nd. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

An agreement with C. E. Poland was read, whereby he agreed to move the improvements and hangar at the airport for the sum of \$900.00. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the City Manager be authorized to enter into an agreement with C. E. Poland for moving the buildings, etc. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

The matter of the rates charged for tank water by the City of

Grand Junction was brought up and discussed. It was shown that our rates are considerably lower than metered water rates, or lower than either Fruita or Palisade charges. It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the City Manager and City Attorney be authorized to draw up an ordinance, amending the rate charged for water sold by the tank, to bring the price to conform with our other water rates. Motion carried.

Some discussion was had concerning the enforcement of sprinkling regulations and the water supply.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
