

Grand Junction, Colorado  
November 25, 1942

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 8:00 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Campbell and President Treece. City Manager Brownson and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City Council proceed to ballot on the names of the applicants for the position of City Attorney. Motion carried.

The City Clerk read letters of application from E. B. Underhill, John C. Banks and Lincoln Coit.

After balloting the vote was announced as follows: John Banks, 5 votes, Lincoln Coit, 2 votes.

It was then moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the ballot indicating a majority vote in favor of John Banks for City Attorney, that Mr. Banks be appointed to that office. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that Mr. Hinman's salary as City Attorney be allowed to December 1st. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was then moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Ross that the Salary of the City Attorney be left the rest of the year 1942, as it now is, and if any adjustment is desired, it will be made before January 1st, 1943. Motion carried.

A letter From the W.P.A. canceling the lease for their portion of the warehouse on South 6th St. and requesting that the 30-day cancellation notice clause be waived, or if the cancellation clause is not waived, notice was given that the lease will terminate as of December 23rd, 1942.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the request of the W.P.A. be granted and the lease terminated on November 30th, 1942. Roll was called upon the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Campbell and Treece. Councilmen voting NO - Robb. A majority of the Councilmen voting AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
