Grand Junction, Colorado

January 18, 1943

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, met in special session at 2 o'clock P.M. on Monday, January 18th, 1943. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Campbell, and President Treece. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks, and City Clerk Tomlinson.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the Council waive the 24-hour written notice of call of meeting. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

The following entitled emergency ordinance was introduced and read: "AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AIRPORT". It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Robb that the ordinance be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance numbered 663, and published in The Daily Sentinel on January 19th. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE on the question. The motion was declared carried.

Bids were opened for the labor for the construction of the hangar and repair shop, at the Airport. Thos McCall & Son presented a bid of \$1,927.00 for the labor on the two buildings. An informal bid was also submitted by Mr. Wilson of Rifle, Colorado, in the amount of \$3,300.00.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Ross that the bid of McCall and Son in the amount of \$1,927.00 be accepted. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
