

Grand Junction, Colorado

March 3, 1943

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Campbell and President Treece. City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson were present.

The minutes of the regular adjourned meeting held Feb. 24th were read and approved.

A proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT CHILDREN UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE SHALL NOT FREQUENT PLACES WHERE SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS ARE SOLD OR ESTABLISHMENTS HAVING POOL, BILLIARD, OR CARD TABLES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH: PROVIDED THAT NO PROPRIETOR OF ANY SUCH BUSINESS SHALL PERMIT MINORS TO FREQUENT HIS PLACE OF BUSINESS: PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ANY FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGE TO MINORS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS: PROHIBITING MINORS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS FROM LOAFING OR LOITERING ABOUT THE STREETS AND ALLEYS: PROVIDING FOR THE DUTY OF PEACE OFFICERS: PROVIDING FOR THE LIABILITY OF A PARENT UPON A SECOND VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE BY THE CHILD: AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS", was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Robb that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING MAP ACCOMPANYING ORDINANCE NO. 432, AND BEING A PART THEREOF", was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Ross that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

A tentative agreement between the City of Grand Junction and The Mesa County Service Center, Inc. was presented and read and discussed. It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Ross that the City Manager be authorized to execute said agreement. Motion carried.

Applications for the renewal of beer licenses for the Hotel de Hamburger and Rettig's Market were presented. It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the applications be approved. Motion carried.

City Manager reported that he had been requested by the Employment Office to bring before the Council the matter of bringing in Japanese who had been investigated by the F.B.I. and found to be loyal American citizens, to help with the farming situation. It was also explained that this matter would be brought before the County Commissioners and also the Board of the Chamber of Commerce. Any action was withheld and the matter ordered tabled for the present.

It was moved by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
