

Grand Junction, Colorado

March 24, 1943

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Campbell, and President Treece. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

An emergency ordinance entitled, "An Emergency Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 660", was introduced and read, being an ordinance amending the Blackout Ordinance by changing various definitions. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Robb that the ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

The following election notice was introduced and read:

NOTICE OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD TUESDAY, THE 6th DAY OF APRIL, A. D. 1943.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION WILL BE HELD ON TUESDAY, THE 6th DAY OF APRIL, A. D. 1943, AT THE POLLING PLACES HEREINAFTER DESIGNATED IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO.

That said General Municipal Election will be held at the several polling places in the several districts of the City of Grand Junction, in the State aforesaid, as follows:

District "A" - Polling Place - City Hall, 6th and Colorado

District "B" - Polling Place - Y.M.C.A. 5th & Rood Ave.

District "C" - Polling Place - Garage at 220 North 7th St.

District "D" - Polling Place - R. Warren Garage at 8th & Main

District "E" - Polling Place - High School Gymnasium -
9th & Chipeta

Upon the date and at the places designated aforesaid, the polls will be open from the hour of 7 o'clock A.M. to and including and will be closed at the hour of 7 o'clock P.M. The ballots to be used in voting will be prepared and furnished by the City Clerk to the judges of the election to be by them furnished to the voters. The election will be held and conducted as nearly as may be, in the manner prescribed by law, in the case of elections for municipal officers. Registration for the said election will take place in the manner now provided by law.

That at said election a member of the City Council will be elected from The City at Large for an unexpired two-year term, and for a regular four-year term from each of two election districts (i.e. Districts "B" and "C") and one member of the City Council will be elected from the City of Grand Junction at large.

That the candidates who have been placed in nomination for Councilmen are as follows:

City at Large - Unexpired two-year term

District "B" - Regular four-year term

District "C" - Regular four-year term
T. J. Treece

City at Large - Regular four-year term

Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.
