## Grand Junction, Colorado

## May 3, 1943

The newly elected City Council of the City of Grand Junction, together with those members whose offices are held over, met in regular session at 10 o'clock A. M. Those present and answering at roll call were Councilmen Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Robb, Campbell and Treece. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The new members of the Council - Glen L. Robb, T. J. Treece, T. S. Campbell and F. A. Hoisington, were sworn into office.

Mr. T. J. Treece presented his resignation as President of the Council. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the resignation be accepted. Motion carried.

Councilman Ross nominated Councilman Hoisington to act as President for the ensuing year. Councilman Hoisington declined, stating that there were others who had served as Councilmen longer than he who should be entitled to the position, and that he was too busy to accept the office at the present time.

Councilman Hoisington nominated Councilman Robb as President of the Council. The nomination was seconded by Councilman Campbell and as there were no further nominations, the motion was passed by the following vote: Those voting AYE - Treece, Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, and Campbell. NO - Robb.

Councilman Robb then took the Chair and was sworn in as President of the Council.

City Manager Brownson then brought up the matter of increasing the size of the hangar at the airport. This is necessary in order for the Navy to continue and enlarge their C.P.T. program here. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the Council authorize the construction of additional hangar space, and that the City Manager and City Attorney draw up ordinances to cover the construction and financing of same. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

Mr. Brownson stated that Thomas McCall had submitted a bid for the construction of the additional hangar space, of \$1020.00. This amount is for labor, as the City has agreed to furnish all materials on the job. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the bid of Thomas McCall be accepted. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman

Treece that the meeting adjourn until the regular meeting Wednesday evening, May 5th, at which time appointments and other matters pertaining to the reorganization of the Council will be considered. Motion carried.
