

Grand Junction, Colorado

September 24, 1943

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Ross, Hoisington, Boston, Treece, Campbell and President Robb. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Ross that the 24-hour written notice of call be waived. Motion carried.

Mr. F. M. (Andy) Veatch appeared before the Council and reported that he had been in Grand Junction since Monday working on the survey of the water and sewer post-war improvement requirements and had the following to submit:

Gentlemen:

In accordance with our verbal agreement made at the meeting August 26, we have made a field study of the various phases of the water problem at Grand Junction, and we are submitting herein our proposal for services in this connection.

We propose to prepare and submit a report which will cover the following features:

1. The work needed at the Kannah Creek Intake, including storage treatment and control.
2. The general design of the parts of the Kannah Creek pipe line which need replacement.
3. An analysis of the water distribution system with recommendations as to main reinforcement and elevated storage.
4. A water supply for the Airport.
5. Salvage of waste water at reservoir.
6. An analysis of additional sources of water supply with an economic study of supplies from the Colorado and Gunnison Rivers.
7. An emergency supply from the Gunnison River.
8. A check of the existing sanitary and combined sewer systems and recommendations as to needed storm sewers.

We will complete and deliver this report as quickly as is consistent with thorough work.

The fee for this report will be \$1,500.00 payable upon its delivery.
