

Grand Junction, Colorado

January 19, 1944

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Harris, Hoisington, Boston, Treece, Campbell and President Robb. Also present were City Manager Brownson and City Clerk Tomlinson. City Attorney Banks was absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting held January 5th and the regular adjourned meeting held January 12th were read and approved.

An application for a 3.2 beer license was presented for Mrs. Fern Trujillo for the Tavern Inn at 101 N. 1st St. It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman Carson that the license be denied. Motion carried.

The Grand Mesa Aux. No. 18 of the United Spanish War Veterans made an application to sell paper carnations on the street the Saturday before Mother's Day. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the request be granted. Motion carried.

The matter of increasing golf membership dues for the Lincoln Park Golf Club was brought up and discussed. It had been proposed that each membership be raised \$5.00 making adult memberships for men, \$20.00, for women, \$11.00 and for children \$8.50.

It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman Carson that the matter be tabled. Motion carried with Councilman Campbell voting NO.

The matter of condemning the property known as 960 Third Avenue was brought up and discussed. City Manager Brownson reported that this shack on this property had been declared "unfit for human habitation". Mrs. Glover the tenant who had lived in the building for a good many years has recently been removed to a convalescent home, and at present the house is empty. It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Carson that the shack on the property at 960 Third Avenue be condemned and torn down. Motion carried.

The Colorado Municipal League in co-operation with the University of Colorado and others are planning an all day session for a planning institute in the City of Grand Junction, probably on Wednesday, Feb. 16. It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City Council co-operate with other organizations in every way to make this meeting a success. Motion carried.

A telegram was received from Mr. "Andy" Veatch, stating that if it were convenient he would like to meet with the Council on January 26th.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn until Wednesday, January 26th at 7:30 o'clock P.M.
