

Grand Junction, Colorado

April 19, 1944

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Harris, Hoisington, Boston, Treece, Campbell and President Robb. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The minutes of the regular meeting held April 4th were read and approved.

W. H. Snyder of the Colorado Survault Co. appeared before the Council in regard to placing Georgia marble monuments in Orchard Mesa Cemetery.

An application for renewal of the 3.2 beer license for the Safeway Store on Fourth and Rood was presented. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Harris that the application be approved and the license granted. Motion carried.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars - Beye-Lotz Auxiliary - requested that they be granted the use of the Auditorium for a dance on the night of May 12th, at the reduced rate of \$10.00 plus costs. They are to use the money from this dance for a war rehabilitation program for ex-service men. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the request be granted. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

City Manager Brownson reported that all the tracts of land on which the City had recently made offers for taxes, had been bid up by individuals and sold at the recent tax sale held by the County Commissioners.

It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Treece that the minutes of the regular meeting held March 1st, 1944, recorded in Volume 20, Page 193, be amended as follows: That the City Treasurer be authorized to sell and assign Special Assessment Tax Sale Certificates covering the properties mentioned in said minutes for an amount equal to the same percentage of the face value of the said certificates as the Board of County Commissioners authorize for the sale of the General Property Tax Certificates held by Mesa County on the property in question; provided that the said Special Assessment Tax Certificates shall not be sold for less than the amounts set forth above; and provided further that the purchaser or assignee thereof shall pay or settle for the General Tax Certificates and after the date authorized by the Board of County Commissioners for the sale of the said General Property Tax Certificates. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The

President declared the motion carried.

City Manager Brownson reported that he had consulted with City Attorney Banks in regard to post war planning for territory contiguous to the City limits, and discussed with the Council matters pertaining to same. It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City Manager get in touch with the County Commissioners on the matter and seek their co-operation toward the proposed developments. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman Carson that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
