

Grand Junction, Colorado

June 26, 1944

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado met in special session at 10 o'clock A.M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were Carson, Harris, Robb, Boston, Treece, Campbell and President Hoisington. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the usual 24-hour notice of call for special meeting be waived. Motion carried.

The meeting was called for the purpose of considering further the removal of the buildings of C.C.C. Camp Dg-2-C. A letter was read from Rep. Rockwell stating that there was considerable confusion in Washington over the imminent need of these buildings for agriculture interests. Messrs. Walker, Luellen and Woods, representing the Chamber of Commerce; Mr. Scatterday and Mr. Peck of the Forest Service; Messrs. Hallam and Beede, representing the Beet Growers; Mr. Talley, President of the Mesa Co. Farm Labor Assn.; Mr. Miller, of the Sebastiani Canning Co.; Messrs. Echternach and Toothacre, representing the Peach Growers, and Mr. Tilton, the Overall Labor Committee, all spoke in connection with the removal of the buildings from Camp Dg-2C. Those who represented the agriculture groups felt that the buildings should not be moved. The other representatives felt that the immediate need was for lumber and that the buildings should be moved to a lumber camp.

The matter of closing the City Hall on July 3rd was brought up and discussed. It was moved by Councilman Robb and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City offices close on Monday July 3rd. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Boston that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
