

Grand Junction, Colorado

August 16, 1944

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Harris, Robb, Boston, Campbell and President Hoisington. Councilmen absent - Treece. Also present were City Manager Brownson and City Attorney Banks. City Clerk Tomlinson was absent.

It was moved, seconded and carried that Mrs. Beth Woolverton be appointed as Acting City Clerk.

The bond of O. W. Glasgow, cement contractor, was presented, having been approved as to form by the City Attorney. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the bond be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

Mr. Stuller appeared before the Council and requested permission to go ahead with his house-moving business if his bond was not received so that it could be approved by the Council. City Attorney Banks recommended against this procedure. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Campbell that as soon as Mr. Stuller's bond arrives it should be referred to the City Attorney for his approval, and after approval, license be issued. Motion carried.

An emergency ordinance for appropriating additional funds to the Moyer Pool Fund was read, but on account of the fact that Councilman Treece was absent, it was held over until the next meeting of the Council.

A proposed ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Changing the Width of the Roadway on Ouray Avenue and Chipeta Avenue between Fifteenth Street and Nineteenth Street in Slocomb's Addition", was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Harris that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

The matter of enforcing the 2-hour parking ordinance was discussed. It was decided to again enforce the 2-hour parking restriction and to give notice to the public that this law is to be strictly enforced every day.

City Manager Brownson reported that the application for a new rubbish truck had been approved by Washington.

The Council then discussed the matter of new equipment needed in the various departments - spray machine, asphalt plant and front-end loader. City Manager Brownson was instructed to put in an application for the front-end loader.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Harris that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
