## Grand Junction, Colorado

## January 24, 1945

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 8:00 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Carson, Robb, Boston, Treece, Campbell and President Hoisington. Councilman Harris was absent. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Treece that the 24-hour notice of meeting be waived. Motion carried.

Discussion was had concerning the issuance of airport bonds, water bonds, and paving intersection bonds. Mr. Brownson had just returned from a trip to Denver where he had interviewed David Lawrence of Boettcher and Co. and Mr. Pershing, Attorney at Law and authority on the issuance of municipal bonds. He read letters from both firms giving prices for the furnishing of all the proceedings toward the issuance of bonds and for the submission to the vote of the people of the general obligation bonds.

It was moved by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Boston that the City Manager go ahead on the basis outlined in the letter from Boettcher & Co., and have them prepare the proceedings for voting at the April election on \$65,000 General obligation Airport bonds @ \$5.00 per thousand and \$35,000 paving intersection general obligation bonds @ \$6.00 per thousand. Roll was called on the motion with the following result: Councilmen voting AYE - Carson, Robb, Boston, Treece, Campbell and Hoisington. Councilmen voting NO - None. All of the Councilmen present answering AYE, the President declared the motion carried.

Mr. Brownson read a letter concerning the forthcoming "Brownout" but no action was taken, it being left to the City Manager and Chief of Police to decide whether any street lights could be dispensed with for the time being.

It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman Treece that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
