

Grand Junction, Colorado

June 26, 1945

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 10:30 o'clock A. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Hoisington, Boston, Carson, Campbell and President Harris. Councilmen absent: Treece and Robb. Also present were City Manager Brownson, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The meeting of the Council was called for the purpose of discussing the proposed hospital to be constructed by the Sisters of Charity on the old Mesa College site. They wished to find out about water and sewer connections. Messrs. Howard McMullin, W. C. Kurtz, Tom Brownson and G. A. Fuller, Jr. Were present and discussed the situation with the members of the Council.

It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman Carson that the City Manager call on the Sisters of Charity and explain the situation to them and report back to the Council at a later meeting. Motion carried.
