Grand Junction, Colorado

October 2, 1946

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Treece, Hoisington, O'Daniel, Boston, Harris and President Carson. Councilman Day was absent. Also present were City Manager Fritz, City Attorney Banks, City Clerk Tomlinson and Chief of the Department of Public Works and Planning, Bennett.

The minutes of the regular meeting held September 18th were read and approved.

Mr. Carter of R. J. Tipton & Associates was to have been present, but on account of bad flying weather, was unable to get to Grand Junction in time for the meeting. He had called Mr. Bennett and Mr. Fritz by telephone and Mr. Bennett reported that they would be ready at the next Council meeting to present plans for the combined construction of water improvements and to advertise for bids. Plans for the proposed river crossing were shown to the Council.

City Manager Fritz reported that the Acting Commissioner of the Bureau of Land Management, after months of effort following up the application of Mr. C. V. Hallenbeck and Mrs. Nevada Farmer for the right-of-way to the Hog Chute -Rimrock Reservoir, has rejected the application. The claims of Mrs. Farmer and Mr. Hallenbeck to this reservoir site were the basis for the agreements between the City of Grand Junction and Mr. Hallenbeck and Mrs. Farmer whereby the City would secure right-of-way to the site in exchange for 15 percent of the water developed. It was moved by Councilman Treece and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the City Manager and City Attorney be authorized to go ahead and make an application for an easement for Hog Chute-Rim Rock Reservoir to the General Land Office immediately. Motion carried.

An ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Providing for a Special Appropriation to the Water Department", was introduced and read. It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Boston that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the City Clerk be authorized to set up a Water Works Improvement Fund into which all moneys from sale of bonds and other funds for the improvements for the Water Department shall be carried, and all expenses for the improvement of the Water Department shall be paid from this account. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman

Harris that the Proof of Publication to the proposed ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 479 Concerning the Electrical Code", be accepted and filed.

The ordinance was then called up for final passage by motion of Councilman Treece, seconded by Councilman Harris and duly carried.

The ordinance was then read, and upon motion of Councilman Hoisington, seconded by Councilman O'Daniel was passed and adopted, numbered 714 and ordered published. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council present voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was reported that Special Sanitary Sewer District No. 4 had been completed. The following Final Estimate and Statement of Cost were presented.

WHEREAS, The City Council has caused to be prepared a statement showing the whole cost of the improvements of said Special Sanitary Sewer District No. 4; including therein two percent additional for cost of collection and other incidentals, and including interest to and including the 28th day of February, 1946, and apportioning the same upon each lot or tract of land or other real estate, to be assessed for the same.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the sewers, manholes and all improvements connected therewith in said District be and the same are hereby accepted, that the said statement be and the same is hereby approved and accepted as the statement showing the whole cost of the entire improvements of said Special Sanitary Sewer District No. 4, including two percent additional for cost of collection and other incidentals and including interest to and including the 28th day of February, 1946, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the same be apportioned on each lot or tract of land, or other real estate, to be assessed for the same and that the same be certified by the President of the Council, and filed in the office of the Clerk, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk shall immediately advertise for three days in The Daily Sentinel, a newspaper of general circulation published in said City, notice to the owners of the real estate to be assessed, and to all persons interested generally without naming such owner or owners, that improvements have been completed and accepted, specifying the whole cost of the improvements and the share so apportioned to each lot or tract of land; that any complaints or objections that may be made in writing by such owners or persons shall be made to the Council and filed with the Clerk within thirty days from the first publication of said notice; that the same may be heard and determined by the Council at the first regular meeting after said thirty days and before the passage of the Ordinance assessing the cost of the improvements, all being in pursuance of the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 178 of said City, as amended.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the improvements in and for said District which are authorized by and are in accordance with the terms and provisions of a Resolution passed and adopted on December 19th, 1945, declaring the intention of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, to create a local improvement district to be known as "Special Sanitary Sewer District No. 4"; with the terms and provisions of a Resolution adopting details and specifications for said District, passed and adopted December 19th, 1945; and with the terms and provisions of a Resolution passed and adopted Feb. 6, 1946, creating and establishing said District. All being in accordance with the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 178 of said City, as amended, and that said improvements have been accepted by the City Engineer and

the City Council of the City of Grand Junction.

That the whole cost of said improvements has been definitely ascertained and is in the sum of \$3,403.35, said amount including two percentum additional for cost of collection and also including interest to and including February 28th, 1947, at the rate of six percentum per annum on the bonds issued from time to time in payment of the cost of said improvements; that the part apportioned to and upon each lot and tract of land within said District and assessable for said improvements is hereinafter set forth; that payment may be made to the Treasurer of the City of Grand Junction at any time within thirty days after the final publication of the assessing ordinance, assessing the real estate in said District for the cost of said improvements, and that the owner so paying would be entitled to an allowance of two percent for all payments made during said period, and of interest from date of payment to the date the first installment becomes due.

That any complaints or objections that may be made in writing by the said owner or owners of land within said District and assessable for said improvements, or any other person interested, made to the City Council and filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City within thirty days from the first publication of this Notice, to-wit: On or before and up to 5:00 o'clock P. A committee sponsoring local observance of the "National Employ the Physically Handicapped Week" requests the support of the Council. No proclamation is requested on account of lack of space in the press. It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the Council go on record as endorsing this movement. Motion carried.

City Manager Fritz reported on legislative agenda of the Colorado Municipal League and new revenues for City funds. He was instructed to prepare the 1947 budget immediately, for consideration of the Council within the next week or so.

It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Treece that the plat of Rose Park Subdivision be accepted for filing and that the date of October 16, 1946, be set for public hearing on this plat; that if the said plat is finally approved by the City Council, then every reasonable means at the disposal of the City will be used to expedite the re-platting of Lots 14 to 25 of Elm Avenue Subdivision so that Lots 33 to 44, Block 1, Rose Park Subdivision will be useable for building purposes. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Treece that October 16, 1946 be set for public hearing on the replatting of South Fifth Subdivision. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the meeting adjourn until October 9, 1946, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Motion carried.
