

Grand Junction, Colorado

October 16, 1946

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Hoisington, O'Daniel, Boston, Harris and President Carson. Absent were Councilmen Treece and Day. Also present were City Manager Fritz, City Attorney Banks, City Clerk Tomlinson, and Chief of the Department of Public Works and Planning Bennett.

The minutes of the regular meeting held October 2 and the regular adjourned meeting held October 9 were read and approved.

Mr. Olin Kalmbach of R. J. Tipton and Associates was present and reported on a few general developments in connection with the water development. He reported that at the next meeting of the Council plans for the entire project would be ready so that bids could be advertised and accepted early in December. Councilman Carson suggested that all efforts be made to secure steel pipe to repair the present river crossing under the river. He suggested that 1/4" steel be used instead of 3/8" and thought it might be possible within the near future to get 1/4" pipe rolled. Mr. Bennett was instructed to go ahead at once with this work.

This date had been set for the hearing on the proposed platting of South Fifth Street Subdivision and Rose Park Subdivision. There were no objections filed to either plat. It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the plot of Rose Park Subdivision be accepted and signed by the President of the Council, attested by the City Clerk, and that it be approved and filed with the Mesa County Clerk and Recorder and that a copy thereof be placed on file in the office of the County Assessor and the City Engineer. Motion carried. It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the plot of South Fifth Street Subdivision be accepted and signed by the President of the Council, attested by the City Clerk, and that it be approved and filed with the Mesa County Clerk and Recorder and that a copy thereof be placed on file in the office of the County Assessor and the City Engineer. Motion carried.

Proof of publication to the proposed ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Providing A Special Appropriation For The Water Department" was presented and read. It was moved by Councilman O'Daniel and seconded by Councilman Harris that the proof of publication be accepted and filed. Motion carried. It was then moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the ordinance be called up for final passage. Motion carried. The ordinance was then read and upon motion of Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman Harris was passed and adopted, numbered 715, and ordered published. Roll was called on the motion with all

members of the Council voting aye. The President declared the motion carried.

Mr. W. C. Tracy, Secretary of Grand Junction Lodge No. 270, Loyal Order of Moose, in a letter to the Council stated that that organization was establishing a club at 345 1/2 Main commencing January 1, 1947, and that they would like to have a liquor license. It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman O'Daniel that the matter be tabled for further information and consideration at a later meeting. Motion carried.

Petitions for construction of a sewer district in Slocomb's Addition and Capitol Hill Subdivision have been received. It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Boston that the petitions be accepted and filed. Motion carried.

City Manager Fritz reported that he had received a telephone call from John R. Seaman stating that the 5 mill additional levy for the City had been approved.

A request for a proclamation on Navy Week was read. It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman Harris that the President of the Council issue a proclamation concerning Navy Week. Motion carried.

Representatives of 4 parking meter companies were present and demonstrated their parking meters to the Council. A fifth company had made a proposal but no representative was present. A sixth company had requested the privilege of making a demonstration and proposition. Those meters demonstrated were M. H. Rhoades Company demonstrating the Perfection Meter which could be installed in 45 days at a price of \$58.00 each. The Park-O-Meter can be installed at \$57.50 plus \$4.00 installation charge which could either be done by the City or by the Company. The Karpark Meter can be installed at \$69.50 plus \$3.00 installation charge which would be optional as to whether the City installed or the Company. The Duncan Miller Meter can be installed at \$75.00 plus freight and could be installed within 90 to 160 days. The matter was referred to the City Manager and Chief of Police for further study to be reported on at a later meeting.

It was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the meeting adjourn.
