

January 16, 1947

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session with the following Councilmen present and answering at roll call: Treece, Hoisington, Boston, Day, Harris, and President Carson. City Manager Fritz, City Attorney Banks, and City Clerk Tomlinson were also present.

The following ordinance was introduced and read: "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONTRACTING OF AN INDEBTEDNESS ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, MESA COUNTY, COLORADO, AND UPON THE CREDIT THEREOF, BY ISSUING THE NEGOTIABLE COUPON BONDS OF SAID CITY IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$430,000, FOR THE PURPOSE OF INCREASING AND IMPROVING THE WATERWORKS SYSTEM OF THE CITY; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A TAX TO PAY SAID BONDS AND THE INTEREST THEREON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY."

It was then moved by Councilman Treece and seconded by Councilman Harris that all rules of the Council which might prevent, unless suspended, the final passage and adoption of said emergency ordinance at this meeting, be and the same are hereby suspended for the purpose of permitting the final passage and adoption of said ordinance at this meeting.

The question being upon the adoption of said motion and the suspension of the rules, the roll was called with the following result: Those voting AYE: Councilmen T. J. Treece, Frank A. Hoisington, O. E. Boston, B. H. Day, Frank A. Harris, and Porter Carson. Those voting NAY: None.

All members of the City Council having voted in favor of said motion, the President declared said motion carried and the rules suspended.

Councilman Treece then moved that said ordinance be finally passed and adopted as introduced, read and ordered published. Councilman Harris seconded the motion.

The question being upon the final passage and adoption of said ordinance, the roll was called with the following result: Those voting AYE: Councilmen T. J. Treece, Frank A. Hoisington, O. E. Boston, B. H. Day, Frank A. Harris, and Porter Carson. Those voting NAY: None.

The President, as presiding officer, thereupon declared that all the members of the City Council duly elected, qualified and acting as such, having voted in favor thereof, the said motion was carried and the said ordinance finally passed and adopted.

On motion duly adopted, it was then ordered that said ordinance be numbered 740; that said ordinance be published in The Daily Sentinel, the official newspaper of the City, in its issue of January 17, 1947, and be recorded and authenticated as required

by law.

It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that Alva A. Brown, 258 Grand Avenue, be appointed as the Councilman for District "B" to serve for the unexpired term of R. O. O'Daniel who recently resigned. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the meeting adjourn.
