

Grand Junction, Colorado

April 11, 1947

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 P.M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Hoisington, Brown, Boston, Day, Harris, and President Carson. Also present were: City Manager Fritz, City Attorney Banks, City Clerk Tomlinson, and Chief of Department of Public Works and Planning Bennett.

A letter from the Kiwanis Club of Grand Junction was read, requesting that the City make available to the Recreation Commission. the approximate sum of \$5,000 derived from the sale of the old Y.M.C.A. building to be used for the cost of operating, maintaining and servicing the Youth Camp on Pinon Mesa. It was explained that there is now earmarked from the sale of the Y.M.C.A. Building the sum of \$4,917. It was moved by Councilman Boston and seconded by Councilman Day that the City give to the Kiwanis Club for the Recreation Commission to be used by the Youth Camp the sum of \$4,000. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

Messrs. Olin Kalmbach and E. H. Carter of R. J. Tipton and Associates, Inc. appeared before the Council and explained to them matters in connection with the construction of Hog Chute and other Grand Mesa reservoirs, explaining the plans and costs in connection with this work. A general discussion was had by the members of the Council with these two engineers. It was moved by Councilman Harris and seconded by Councilman Hoisington that the City Manager go before the Grand Mesa Reservoir Company and let them know that the City has decided to go ahead with the construction of Hog Chute Reservoir, but that they will go along with the Reservoir Company on the improvements which they contemplate. Motion carried.

It was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the meeting adjourn.
