## Grand Junction, Colo.

Aug. 18, 1949

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Harper, Carson, Dufford, Colescott, Martin, Hanson and President Hoisington. Also present were City Manager Moore, City Attorney Banks and City Clerk Tomlinson.

The following emergency ordinance was presented and read:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO WATER REVENUE BONDS IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$100,000, FOR THE PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND THE INTEREST THEREON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY."

It was then moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Martin that all rules of the Council of the City of Grand Junction, which unless suspended, might prevent the final passage and adoption of this Ordinance at this meeting, be and the same are hereby suspended for the purpose of permitting the final passage and adoption of this Ordinance at this meeting.

The question being upon the adoption of said motion and the suspension of the rules, the roll was called with the following results:
