

Grand Junction, Colo.

Feb. 4, 1950

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in special session at 7:30 o'clock P. M. Councilmen present and answering at roll call were: Harper, Carson, Dufford, Colescott, Martin, Hanson and President Hoisington. Also present were City Attorney Banks, City Clerk Tomlinson and Acting City Manager Burton.

The City Treasurer stated that on account of the fact that approximately \$40,000 water bonds came due on the 1st day of January, and in changing the water billing so that the City is zoned, sufficient funds were not being received to keep the bank balances sufficient to pay all the warrants as they came in. He requested permission to use the money left in the Water Construction bond fund until sufficient monies are received to carry the regular expenses of the City.

It was moved by Councilman Harper and seconded by Councilman Hanson that the City Treasurer be instructed to transfer up to \$20,000 Water Construction bond money over to the general checking account temporarily, the money to be replaced as quickly as possible, when revenues have built up the checking account sufficiently to take care of the general expenses of the City. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

Councilman Carson reported that he was going to attend a meeting in Collbran on Tuesday, Feb. 7th on the Collbran project. It was moved by Councilman Martin and seconded by Councilman Dufford that Councilman Carson be given permission to represent the City at this meeting and do all he could to persuade the Collbran people of the advisability of constructing this project. Motion carried.

Councilman Harper and City Attorney Banks were excused at this time.

Councilmen Dufford and Carson reported that they had held another conference with Jas. Rigg, Jr. and also Valley Air Service. Rigg had stated that he would like to have the old hangar building when it was to be torn down and that he would keep the weeds cleaned up and the runways graded. Another small building was desired by Mr. Gregg. It was moved by Councilman Martin and seconded by Councilman Hanson that the City give these buildings to Rigg and Valley Air, but that they be moved immediately. Details of the deal are to be worked out later and incorporated in the contracts to be drawn up with these men. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council present voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carson and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
