

April 17, 1952

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction met in special session at 8:00 A. M., Thursday, April 17th. Councilmen present and answering roll call were Harper, Hoisington, Ela, Colescott, Carson, Walt and President Hanson. Also present were City Manager Toyne and City Clerk Tomlinson.

It was moved by Councilman Harper and seconded by Councilman Walt that the Council waive the formal twenty-four hour notice of meeting. Motion carried.

APPOINT JAS. GROVES, CITY ATTORNEY. It was moved by Councilman Hoisington and seconded by Councilman Walt that the City employ Mr. James Groves as City Attorney, his services to start May 1, 1952, and to receive the presently established salary for City Attorney.

Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting "AYE." The President declared the motion carried.

BANKS TO COMPLETE REVISION OF ORDINANCES. Councilman Walt stated that in view of the fact that Mr. Banks had partially completed the codification of the ordinances of the City of Grand Junction and that he was well informed on all matters pertaining to the ordinances, he thought Mr. Banks should proceed with the revision, codification and compilation of the ordinances which he has started on. The following proposed ordinance was presented and read: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REVISION, CODIFICATION, COMPILATION AND PUBLICATION IN BOOK FORM OF ALL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, OF A GENERAL AND PERMANENT NATURE AND ALL ORDINANCES IMPOSING ANY FINE, PENALTY OR FORFEITURE."

It was moved by Councilman Walt and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Harper and seconded by Councilman Ela that the meeting adjourn.
