<u>RESOL. APPROVE DOG ORD. AMENDMENT.</u> The following Resolution was presented and read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the returns of the special municipal election held in the City of Grand Junction, October 18, 1956, as shown by the report of the canvassing board filed October 18, 1956, it appears that there were 1773 votes in favor of and 660 votes against amending Section 1 of Peoples Ordinance No. 30 to read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person owning or possessing a dog to permit it to be at large within the limits of the City of Grand Junction and every person owning or having a dog shall confine it to his or her premises when not on leash and under the immediate control of a competent and responsible attendant. The head of any household having a dog in its possession shall be presumed to be the owner or possessor of such dog.

making a majority in favor of adoption of such amendment by 1113 votes.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That said amendment was approved and adopted at such election; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said amendment be passed and adopted and that the Clerk be and is hereby ordered to publish said amendment in the Daily Sentinel, as passed and adopted.

It was moved by Councilman Shults and seconded by Councilman Emerson that the Resolution be passed and adopted as read. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council present voting "AYE." The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Harper and seconded by Councilman Emerson that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
