#### ROLL CALL

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 o'clock p. m., April 5, 1961. Councilmen present and answering roll call were Hadden, Meacham, Love, Colescott, Lowe, Wright and President McCormick. Also present were City Manager Lacy, City Attorney Ashby and City Clerk Tomlinson.

#### INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Rev. Lee Richstein, Assistant Pastor, First Baptist Church.

# MINUTES

It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the minutes of the regular meeting held on March 15, 1961 be approved as written. Motion carried. (7 Councilmen voting AYE)

HEARING POSTPONED On Zoning 1st & Orchard Ave. - to April 19

It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Hadden that the hearing on the proposed zoning at First Street and Orchard Avenue be postponed until April 19th, and that the advertising for the change of date for said hearing be ratified by the Council. Motion carried. (7 Councilmen voting AYE.)

<u>LIQUOR LICENSE GRANTED</u> Jim & Mary Pantuso dba Pantuso's Pizzeria, 101 No. 1st St.

This was the date set for hearing on the application of Jim and Mary Pantuso dba "Pantuso's Pizzeria" at 101 North First Street for a restaurant liquor license. A petition signed by a number of the residents of the neighborhood approving the granting of the license was presented and a letter from the Chief of Police was read. There were no opposing petitions.

It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the application be approved and license granted when the state license has been received. Motion carried. (7 Councilmen voting AYE)

**LIQUOR LICENSE GRANTED** Katherine Blackshear at the St. Regis Hotel, 4th & Colo.

This was the date set for hearing on the application for a restaurant liquor license of Katherine Blackshear at the St. Regis Hotel, 4th & Colorado. Mr. Raso, Attorney, spoke in behalf of Mrs. Blackshear, and also stated that the new owners of the St. Regis Hotel expect to remodel the restaurant at the hotel as soon as possible. A petition was filed signed by residents of the area approving Mrs. Blackshear's application and a letter from Chief of Police Johnson was read. There were no opposing petitions filed and no one from the audience protested the granting of this license. President McCormick closed the hearing.

I, Helen C. Tomlinson, Clerk of the City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado, hereby certify that the following Amendments to the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, were enacted by a majority of the electors voting thereon on April 8, 1969, and that the vote for and against each Amendment was as hereafter listed:

Repeal of Section 26 of Article II.

That Section 26 of Article II of the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, relating to the use of voting machines be repealed.

Amendment of Section 38 of Article IV:

38. SALARIES. At least two meetings of the City Council shall be held monthly at such times as may be fixed by the Council, such two meetings to be known as the regular meetings. All other meetings of the City Council shall be known as special meetings, or adjournment of the regular meetings. The President of the Council shall be paid a salary of \$125.00 per month, and all other Councilmen shall be paid a salary of \$100.00 per month.

Amendment of Section 56 of Article VII:

56. APPOINTIVE OFFICES - POWER OF COUNCIL. The said Council shall appoint a City Manager by a majority vote, who shall be the Chief Executive Officer to the City, and who need not, at the time of his appointment, be a resident of Grand Junction or of the State of Colorado; a City Attorney; and a Judge of the Municipal Court. The City Manager prior to his appointment shall either have had a successful experience in city management of a city operating under the Council-Manager form of city government, or had comparable experience. The Council shall have power, except as otherwise provided in this Charter, to fix the salaries and official bonds, establish the qualifications, and prescribe the powers and duties of all officers and employees of the City. The Council shall further have power to create offices and to alter the powers and duties relating thereto. Provided, that nothing in this section shall be taken to give the Council power to diminish the power of City Manager or to alter the relation established by this Charter between the City Manager and the other officers and employees of the City.

Amendment of Section 61 of Article VII:

61. CITY CLERK-DUTIES. The City Clerk shall be the Clerk of the Council and record and keep all the proceedings thereof. It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to affix the seal of the City to contracts and all other documents whenever the same shall be necessary. The City Clerk shall safely keep all books, records and other documents required to be filed in his office. The City Clerk shall perform all duties characteristic of his office as City Clerk, and the Council may prescribe other powers and duties to be performed by him by ordinance of the City.

66. FINANCE DIRECTOR-CITY TREASURER. There shall be a Finance Director who shall be the custodian of the moneys of the City, and who, unless another is so designated, shall be ex-officio City Treasurer. He shall be the head of the Finance Department of the City. He shall pay money from the city treasury upon warrant signed by the manager and countersigned by the finance director and upon check signed by the finance director or his deputy. He shall have such other powers and duties as the Council may by ordinance provide.

**CHARTER AMENDMENT** TV Permits To be published & filed with Secy of State

The following Resolution was presented and read:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, There was submitted to the qualified electors of the City of Grand Junction, at a general municipal election held on the 4th day of April, 1961, in the City of Grand Junction, the question of adopting an amendment to the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, as follows:

Amending Section 127 of Article XIV thereof to read as follows:

Section 127. REVOCABLE PERMITS. The Council may grant a permit at any time, in or upon any street, alley, or public place, provided such permit may be revocable by the Council at its pleasure at any time, whether such right to revoke be expressly reserved in

such permit or not; provided, however, that no such permit shall be granted for the use of any such street, alley or other public place for the installation or maintenance of a cable system TV, otherwise known as C.A.T.V. system, until the granting of such permit shall be approved by a majority vote of the qualified electors of the City.

WHEREAS, at said election 1802 votes were cast in favor of the adoption of said amendment and 995 votes were cast against said amendment, the majority being in favor of the adoption thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the City Clerk be and she is hereby authorized and instructed to publish once in The Daily Sentinel of Grand Junction, Colorado, the full text of said Charter Amendment, and she is further authorized and instructed to file with the Secretary of State two copies officially certified by her, within ten days after April 4th, 1961.

LAND PURCHASE Report on - Near Westside Sewage Disposal Plant

Councilman Meacham, as Chairman of a Committee appointed to report on the matter of purchasing land near the westside sewage disposal plant, reported that his committee, together with Mr. Lacy, had met down in the area of the property in question and had looked over all of the properties and had tried to analyze the situation and decide on the basis of the City's need for land

acquisition. The land acquisition fund is a budgeted item and is low at the present time and for that reason they decided to postpone purchasing any more land until there is more money in this fund and more need by the City for the land in this area.

Some comments were made by Councilmen and City Manager Lacy on the advisability of acquiring this land in the near future. President McCormick thanked the Committee for the time they had spent in making this investigation and report.

3.2 BEER LICENSE RENEWAL FOR SYLVESTER J. & LELA LEHN dba LEE & SILVER'S CAFE, 326 Main St.

Sylvester J. and Lela Lehn dba Lee and Silver's Cafe, 326 Main Street, presented an application for the renewal of their 3.2 beer license. A letter was read from Police Chief Karl Johnson having no objection to the renewal of his license. It was moved by Councilman Hadden and seconded by Councilman Wright that the application be approved and license granted when the state license has been received. Motion carried. (6 Councilmen voting AYE)

Ute Ave. Hearing 5-3-61

Dante Raso of the Raso Liquor Store made application for a change of address for his liquor store license from 220 South Second Street to 202 Ute Ave. It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the application be advertised for hearing on May 3, 1961. A petition for the annexation of the following described area was presented and read:

# PETITION FOR ANNEXATION

WE THE UNDERSIGNED do hereby petition the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, State of Colorado, to annex the following described property to the said City:

Beginning at the intersection of the westerly line Grand Valley Canal with the South line Southwest Quarter Northeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 1 South, Range 1 West, U.M. thence West along the said South line 333 feet to the East line of the drain ditch, thence North along the drain ditch 300 feet thence East 75

feet more or less to the West line of Pomona View Subdivision, thence Northeasterly along the said West line to the Northeast corner Lot 14 of said Subdivision, thence South 57.76 feet, thence East to the Northwest corner of Lot 12 in said Subdivision, thence North 50 feet, thence East 100 feet to the East line of the Southwest Quarter Northeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 1 South, Range 1 West, U.M., thence South along the said East line to the Southeast corner of said Southwest Quarter Northeast Quarter, thence West along the South line of said Southwest Quarter Northeast Quarter to the Point of Beginning.

As grounds therefor, the petitioners respectfully show to the said Council that the said territory is eligible for annexation in that it is not embraced within any city or town, that it abuts upon or is contiguous to the City of Grand Junction in a manner which will afford reasonable ingress and egress thereto, that more than one-sixth of the aggregate exterior boundary of the territory proposed to be annexed coincides with the existing boundary of the said City, and that the non-contiguous boundary of the said territory coincides with the existing block lines, street lines, or governmental subdivision lines.

This petition is accompanied by four copies of a map or plat of the said territory, showing its boundary and its relation to established city limit lines, and said map is prepared upon a material suitable for filing.

Your petitioners further state that they are the owners of more than fifty per cent of the area of such territory to be annexed and also comprise a majority of the land owners residing in the said territory; that a description of the land owned by each signer, together with his residence address and other descriptive facts are set forth hereafter opposite the name of each signer.

WHEREFORE these petitioners pray that this petition be accepted and that the said annexation be approved and accepted by ordinance.

<u>WATER</u> Micro-strainer Filter Plant - approve location - near Hallenbeck Reservoir

Mr. W. F. Turney was present and presented to the Council a preliminary report on the construction of the micro-strainer filter plant. - 3. That this resolution shall not apply to applications for renewals of existing licenses but only to those applications for new licenses.
