ROLL CALL

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 p.m. April 18, 1962. Councilmen present and answering roll call were Hadden, Meacham, Love, Colescott, Lowe, Wright and President McCormick. Also present were City Manager Lacy, City Attorney Ashby and City Clerk Tomlinson.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Rev. Bernard Gillick, Pastor, Saint Joseph's Catholic Church.

MINUTES

It was moved by Councilman Meacham and seconded by Councilman Hadden that the minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction held on April 4, 1962 be approved as written. (7 voted AYE)

TRADING STAMP ISSUE

Discussed - no action

There was some discussion concerning the trading stamp issue. City Manager Lacy had sent copies of court decisions, ordinances and laws from the State of Wyoming to the Council for their study previous to the meeting. An old Colorado Supreme Court decision states that it is legal to use stamps in this state. The Wyoming state law and Supreme Court does not allow them in that state. Councilman Colescott suggested that the matter should be taken to the people for a vote. President McCormick stated that the Council would not make a decision at this time, and that everyone would be given ample notice of a hearing whenever the Council does consider it. Mr. Hockensmith, Attorney, stated that the only comment he would like to make at this time was that Colorado law says that the stamps are legal.

ORD. #1152 PASSED

Re-zoning Central Fruitvale

The Proof of Publication to the following entitled proposed ordinance was presented and read: AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE ZONING MAP, A PART OF CHAPTER 83 OF THE 1953 COMPILED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, BY CHANGING THE ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY WITHIN SAID CITY. It was moved by Councilman Lowe and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the Proof of Publication be accepted and filed. Motion carried. (7 voted AYE)

It was moved by Councilman Colescott and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the ordinance be called up for final publication. Motion carried. (7 voted AYE)

The ordinance was then read, and it was moved by Councilman Hadden and seconded by Councilman Lowe that it be passed, adopted, numbered 1152 and ordered published. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried. (7 voted AYE)

I.D. NO. 59

(Operation Foresight)

City Manager Lacy presented plans and specifications for the construction of Improvement District No. 59. Councilman Meacham asked the City Manager what arrangements were being made to eliminate or cut down on the number of curb cuts on Main Street.

City Manager Lacy stated that they hoped there would be no curb cuts in the three shopping center blocks. They were trying to cut out as many as possible in the whole area. Driveways for two filling stations have not been resolved as yet. Curbs are to be extended across the alley entrances in the 600 block on Main Street. The property owners have been contacted and are willing for these alley-ways to be closed. In a few instances it may be necessary for businesses to have entrances from the street.

RESOLUTION

ADOPTING DETAILS, PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR CONSTRUCTING SIDEWALKS, CURBS AND GUTTERS AND PAVING STREETS IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, IN IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 59, DETERMINING THE NUMBER OF INSTALLMENTS AND THE TIME IN WHICH THE COST OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE PAYABLE, THE RATE OF INTEREST ON UNPAID INSTALLMENTS AND THE DISTRICT OF LANDS TO BE ASSESSED WITH THE COST OF THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS, AND AUTHORIZING NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CREATE SAID DISTRICT AND A HEARING THEREON.

WHEREAS, on the 20th day of December, 1961, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, by a Resolution, authorized the City Engineer to prepare and file full details, plans and specifications for constructing sidewalks, curbs and gutters and paving streets in said City within proposed Improvement District No. 59, together with an estimate of the total cost of such improvements and a map of the District to be assessed; and,

WHEREAS, said City Engineer has fully and strictly complied with the directions so given, and has filed such details, plans, specifications, estimate and map, all in accordance with said Resolution, and the requirements of Ordinance No. 178, as amended, of said City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO:

1. That said details, plans, specifications, estimates and map, be, and the same are hereby, approved and adopted.

2. That the district of lands to be assessed with the cost of the proposed removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; constructing pavement widening nine (9) feet wide, consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved, is described as follows:

Lots 16 to 30, both inclusive, in both Blocks 94 and 116.
Lots 17 to 32, both inclusive, in Blocks 96, 97, 117, 118, 119 and 120.
Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, in Blocks 102, 103, 123 and 124.
Lots 1 to 15, both inclusive, in Blocks 105 and 127.
Lots 1 to 22, both inclusive, in Block 125.
Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, and Lots 27 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 126.
All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

3. That the district of lands to be assessed with the cost of the proposed removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, ten (10) feet wide; constructing of pavement widening seven (7) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved, is described as follows:

Lots 11 to 22, both inclusive, in Blocks 96, 101 and 120.
Lots 1 to 6, both inclusive, Lots 11 to 22, both inclusive and Lots 27 to 32, both inclusive, in Blocks 102, 103, 117, 118 and 119.
Lots 17 to 22, both inclusive, and Lots 27 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 104.
Lots 1 to 6, both inclusive, and Lots 25 to 30, both inclusive, in Blocks 105 and 116.
All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

4. That the district of lands to be assessed with the cost of the proposed removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; constructing pavement widening seventeen (17) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, is described as follows:

Lots 11 to 22, both inclusive, in Block 81, City of Grand Junction.

5. That the district of lands to be assessed with the cost of the proposed removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk, six (6) feet wide plus a concrete slab forty one (41) feet by nine and one-half (9 1/2) feet; constructing of pavement widening six (6) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, is described as follows:

Lots 1 to 12, both inclusive, in Block 121, City of Grand Junction.

6. That the district of lands to be assessed with the cost of the proposed removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with a vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk twelve (12) feet wide; constructing of pavement widening four (4) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved, is described as follows:

Lots 13 to 24, both inclusive, in Block 100.

Lots 17 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 101.

Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, in Block 120.

All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

7. That the district of lands to be assessed with the cost of the proposed removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and the constructing of a Shopping Park consisting of a concrete sidewalk fourteen (14) feet wide, a traveled street way consisting of two traffic lanes eleven (11) feet wide each winding through each block to provide access to angle parking on one side of the street only on alternate ends of the block. Also, to be provided is a maneuvering lane ten (10) feet wide behind the angle parking areas and mid-block crosswalks with raised sidewalk approaches. The park-like features shall include textured pavement and concrete walks with covered gutters and structures for beautification and customer convenience; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved, is described as follows:

Lots 17 to 32, both inclusive, in Blocks 102, 103, and 104.

Lots 16 to 30, both inclusive, in Block 105.

Lots 1 to 15, both inclusive, in Block 116.

Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, in Blocks 117, 118, and 119.

All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

8. The assessment to be levied against the property in said District to pay the cost of such improvements shall be due and payable without demand, within thirty days after the ordinance assessing such cost becomes final and if paid during such period, the amount added for collection, incidentals and interest shall be deducted; provided, that all such assessments may, at the election of the owners of property in said District, be paid in ten (10) equal installments, the first of which shall be payable at the time the next installment of general taxes are, by the laws of the State of Colorado, may payable, after the expiration of said thirty (30) days; and the following annual installments shall be paid on or before the same date each year thereafter, with interest, in all cases, on unpaid principal, payable annually at the rate of not to exceed six (6) per centum per annum.

9. Notice of Intention to Create Said Improvement District No. 59, and of a Hearing thereon, shall be given by advertisement in one issue of the Daily Sentinel, a newspaper of general circulation published in said City, which notice shall be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

OF INTENTION TO CREATE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 59 IN THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, AND OF A HEARING THEREON.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the owners of real estate in the District hereinafter described, and to all persons generally interested, that the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, intends to create Improvement District No. 59 in said City for the purpose of constructing sidewalks, curbs and gutters and paving on streets to serve the property hereinafter described:

A. Remove existing curb, gutter and sidewalks and replace with concrete combination curb-sidewalk seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; construct pavement widening nine (9) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto.

1. Both sides of Rood Avenue from Third Street to Fifth Street and Sixth Street to Seventh Street.

2. Both sides of Colorado Avenue from Second Street to Seventh Street.

3. Both sides of Fifth Street from Colorado Avenue to Ute Avenue.

B. Remove existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replace with concrete combination curb-sidewalk ten (10) feet wide; construct pavement widening seven (7) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto.

1. Both sides of Third Street from Rood Avenue to Colorado Avenue.

2. Both sides of Fourth Street from Rood Avenue to Colorado Avenue.

3. Both sides of Fifth Street from White Avenue to Colorado Avenue.

4. Both sides of Sixth Street from Rood Avenue to Colorado Avenue.

C. Remove existing curb and gutter and sidewalk and replace with concrete combination curb-sidewalk seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; construct pavement widening seventeen (17) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch mat of asphalt or gilsapave; all plus incidentals thereto.

1. West side of Fifth Street from Grand Avenue to White Avenue.

D. Remove existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replace with a vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk six (6) feet wide, plus a concrete slab forty-one (41) feet by nine and one-half (9 1/2) feet; construct pavement widening six (6) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto.

1. South side of Main Street from First Street to Second Street.

E. Remove existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replace with a vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk twelve (12) feet wide; construct pavement widening four (4) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto.

1. Main Street from Second Street to Third Street and the North side of Main Street from First Street to Second Street.

F. Remove existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replace with Shopping Center area consisting of a concrete sidewalk fourteen (14) feet wide, a traveled street way consisting of two traffic lanes eleven (11) feet wide each winding through each block to provide access to angle parking on one side of the street only on alternate ends of the block. Also, to be provided is a maneuvering lane ten (10) feet wide behind the angle parking areas and mid-block crosswalks with raised sidewalk approaches. The park-like features shall include textured pavement and concrete walks with covered gutters and structures for beautification and customer convenience; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved.

1. Main Street from Third Street to Seventh Street.

That the said Improvement District shall include all of the following described real estate:

Portion to be assessed with the cost of the removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; constructing pavement widening nine (9) feet wide, consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved:

Lots 16 to 30, both inclusive, in both Blocks 94 and 116.

Lots 17 to 30, both inclusive, in Blocks 96, 97, 117, 118, 119 and 120.

Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, in Blocks 102, 103, 123, and 124.

Lots 1 to 15, both inclusive, in Blocks 105 and 127.

Lots 1 to 22, both inclusive, in Block 125.

Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, and Lots 27 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 126.

All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

Portion to be assessed with the cost of the removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, ten (10) feet wide; constructing of pavement widening seven (7) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved:

Lots 11 to 22, both inclusive, in Blocks 96, 101 and 120.

Lots 1 to 6, both inclusive, Lots 11 to 22, both inclusive and Lots 27 to 32, both inclusive, in Blocks 102, 103, 117, 118 and 119.

Lots 17 to 22, both inclusive, and Lots 27 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 104.

Lots 1 to 6, both inclusive, and Lots 25 to 30, both inclusive, in Blocks 105 and 116.

All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

Portion to be assessed with the cost of removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; constructing pavement widening seventeen (17) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto:

Lots 11 to 22, both inclusive, in Block 81, City of Grand Junction.

Portion to be assessed with the cost of the removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk, six (6) feet wide plus a concrete slab forty-one (41) feet by nine and one-half (9 1/2) feet; constructing of pavement widening six (6) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto:

Lots 1 to 12, both inclusive, in Block 121, City of Grand Junction.

Portion to be assessed with the cost of the removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with a vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk twelve (12) feet wide; constructing of pavement widening four (4) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved:

Lots 13 to 24, both inclusive, in Block 100.

Lots 17 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 101.

Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, in Block 120.

All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

Portion to be assessed with the cost of the removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and the constructing of a

Shopping Park area consisting of a concrete sidewalk fourteen (14) feet wide, a traveled street way consisting of two traffic lanes eleven (11) feet wide each winding through each block to provide access to angle parking on one side of the street only on alternate ends of the block. Also, to be provided is a maneuvering lane ten (10) feet wide behind the angle parking areas and mid-block crosswalks with raised sidewalk approaches; the park-like features shall include textured pavement and concrete walks with covered gutters and structures for beautification and customer convenience; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved:

Lots 17 to 32, both inclusive, in Blocks 102, 103, and 104.

Lots 16 to 30, both inclusive, in Block 105.

Lots 1 to 15, both inclusive, in Block 116.

Lots 1 to 16, both inclusive, in Blocks 117, 118, and 119.

All Blocks in the City of Grand Junction.

The probable total cost of said improvements as shown by the estimate of the City Engineer is \$278,745.00 exclusive of costs of collection, interest and incidentals.

The maximum share of such total cost shall be as follows:

For removing existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; constructing pavement widening nine (9) feet wide, consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved - \$10.80 per front foot.

For removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, ten (10) feet wide; constructing of pavement widening seven (7) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved - \$11.40 per front foot.

For removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with concrete combination curb-sidewalk, seven and one-half (7 1/2) feet wide; constructing pavement widening seventeen (17) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved - \$13.25 per front foot.

For removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk, six (6) feet wide plus a concrete slab forty-one (41) feet by nine and one-half (9 1/2) feet; constructing of pavement widening six (6) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto - \$14.00 per front foot.

For removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and replacing the same with a vertical type curb and gutter and sidewalk twelve (12) feet wide; constructing of pavement widening four (4) feet wide consisting of at least six (6) inches of gravel base over a compacted subgrade with a two (2) inch asphalt or gilsapave mat; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved - \$19.00 per front foot.

For removing of the existing curb, gutter and sidewalk and the construction of a Shopping Park area consisting of a concrete sidewalk fourteen (14) feet wide, a traveled street way consisting of two traffic lanes eleven (11) feet wide each winding through each block to provide access to angle parking on one side of the street only on alternate ends of the block. Also, to be provided is a maneuvering lane ten (10) feet wide behind the angle parking areas and mid-block crosswalks with raised sidewalk approaches; the park-like features shall include textured pavement and concrete walks with covered gutters and structures for beautification and customer convenience; all plus incidentals thereto, with widths applying on both sides of streets involved - \$39.60 per front foot.

To all of said estimated cost there shall be added six (6) per cent for costs of collection and incidentals, and also interest at the rate borne by the special assessment bonds of said district to the next succeeding date upon which general taxes, or the first installment thereof, are by the laws of the State of Colorado made payable. The said assessment shall be due and

payable, without demand, within thirty (30) days after the ordinance assessing such cost shall have become final, and if paid during such period, the amount added for collection and incidentals shall be deducted; provided that all such assessments may, at the election of the owners of the property in said district, be paid in ten (10) equal annual installments which become due upon the same date upon which general taxes, or the first installment thereof, are by the laws of the State of Colorado made payable. Interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum shall be charged on unpaid installments.

On the 23rd of May, A. D. 1962, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. in the Council Chambers in the City Hall of the said City, the Council will consider the ordering of the proposed improvements and will hear all complaints and objections that may be made in writing concerning the proposed improvements, by the owners of any real estate to be assessed, or by any person interested.

A map of the district, from which the approximate share of the total estimated cost to be assessed upon each piece of real estate in the district may be readily ascertained, and all proceedings of the Council in the premises are on file and can be seen and examined by any person interested therein, in the office of the City Clerk during business hours, at any time prior to said hearing.

It was moved by Councilman Lowe and seconded by Councilman Hadden that the City Manager be authorized to advertise for bids for bonds for Improvement District No. 59 to be opened on May 22, 1962. Motion carried. (7 voted AYE)

DAYS

Selling on streets-not to discontinue custom

City Manager Lacy reported that he had asked Karl Johnson, Police Chief, to find out whether or not the merchants in the downtown area were opposed to the sale of various flowers, tags, etc. on the streets on Saturdays during the spring months. Mr. Johnson reported that he had worked with Mr. Hollingsworth of the Chamber of Commerce. There were some complaints from the shoppers, but at the present time, there was no wish to discontinue this custom.

Councilman Hadden stated that there was no need to go any further with this investigation at this time.

BUDGET

Transfer \$45,000 fr Water supply Div to Utilities Systems

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide funds for the extension of water lines into the recently annexed Fruitvale area, such funds being presently within the budget of the Utilities Department of the City of Grand Junction in a division other than the Utilities Systems;

That there be, and there hereby is, transferred within the Utilities Department Budget of the City, funds in the amount of Forty-five Thousand (\$45,000.00) Dollars from the Water Supply Division, under budgetary item 83-31A, to the Utilities Systems Division to be expended under budgetary category 82-31A for the extension of water lines into the Fruitvale area annexed to the City.
