#### Grand Junction, Colorado

November 6, 1963

#### ROLL CALL

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 p.m., November 6, 1963. Councilmen present and answering roll call were Ray A. Meacham, Harry O. Colescott, Warren D. Lowe and President McCormick. Councilmen Chas. H. Love and Herbert M. Wright were absent. Also present were City Manager Joe Lacy, City Attorney Gerald J. Ashby and City Clerk Helen C. Tomlinson.

#### INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Rev. A. J. Bertrand, Pastor, St. Joseph's Catholic Church.

### MINUTES

It was moved by Councilman Lowe and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the minutes of the regular meeting of October 16th and the special meeting of October 28th be approved as written. Motion carried. (4 AYES)

BLDG PMT FEES - Waived for Catholic School, 7th & Bookcliff

A request was presented by the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish School Building Committee that the building permit fee for their new school building at 7th and Bookcliff be waived. It was moved by Councilman Colescott and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the request be granted. Motion carried. (4 AYES)

REV PMT - Fence on E side Orchard Ave. School - 4144 Rev Pmt

Mesa County Valley School District No. 51 presented a request for a revocable permit to install a fence upon a portion of the alley right of way at Orchard Ave. School, 19th and Orchard Ave. The fence in question runs along the east boundary of Orchard Ave. School. Originally forty feet was dedicated for street use, but it has not been necessary to use it as a street. By allowing only 20 feet of travel space will encourage it to be used as an alley and discourage traffic use of it as a street. The Planning Commission at its meeting on October 30th felt that the situation as it now exists is dangerous for the children playing on the playground, and it is undesirable for street purposes.

The following Resolution and Revocable Permit were presented and read:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Mesa County Valley School District No. 51 has petitioned the City Council of the City of Grand Junction for a revocable permit to install a fence upon a portion of the alley right-ofway in the manner following to-wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 12, Block 4, Fairmont Subdivision, City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado, thence East twenty feet, thence North six hundred feet more or less, parallel to the East line of Lot 12; two hundred twenty feet to be installed immediately, four hundred feet to be installed at a later date if required; and

WHEREAS, such action has been heretofore approved by the City Planning Commission and City Engineer and would eliminate what is presently a hazard to the interests of the inhabitants of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO:

That the City Manager on behalf of the City and as the act of the City be, and he is hereby, authorized to grant such revocable permit to the above-named school district for the purposes above described upon the execution by the school district to save and hold the City harmless for any claims arising out of the construction and use granted and execution by the school district of an agreement that upon the revocation of such permit the school district will remove said fencing at its own expense, restoring the right-of-way to its original condition.

## REVOCABLE PERMIT

WHEREAS, Mesa County Valley School District No. 51 has petitioned the City Council of the City of Grand Junction for a revocable

permit to install a fence upon a portion of the alley right-of-way in the manner following, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 12, Block 4, Fairmont Subdivision, City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado, thence East twenty feet, thence North six hundred feet more or less, parallel to the East line of Lot 12. Two hundred twenty feet to be installed immediately, four hundred feet to be installed at a later date if required.

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission and City Engineer have approved such action, and the City Council is of the opinion that such would eliminate what is presently a hazard to the interests of the inhabitants of the City at this time and has directed the City Engineer to issue a permit for such use;

NOW, THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO:

There is hereby granted to Mesa County Valley School District No. 51 a revocable permit to install upon the City right-of-way for the purposes above stated; provided however, that said permit may be revoked by the City Council at its pleasure at any time; provided further that the above-named school district shall agree to indemnify the City and hold it harmless from any and all claims, damages, actions, costs and expenses of every kind in any manner arising out of, or resulting from, the permitted use; and provided further that said school district shall agree that upon the revocation of such permit it will at its own expense remove said fencing and restore the right-of-way to its original condition.
