ROLL CALL

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular session at 7:30 p.m., January 6, 1965. Councilmen present and answering roll call were Ray A. Meacham, R. B. Evans, Harry O. Colescott, Warren D. Lowe, Herbert M. Wright, and President McCormick. Councilman Charles H. Love was absent. Also present were City Manager Lacy, City Attorney Ashby and City Clerk Tomlinson.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Rev. J. Kenneth Baird, Pastor, First Christian Church.

MINUTES

It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Meacham that the minutes of the regular meeting held December 16, 1964 be approved as written. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

<u>LIQUOR LICENSE - TRANSFER FOR A.W. & A.E. HAMMER DRUG FROM 158</u> MAIN STREET TO 524 N. 1ST STREET

Hearing had been advertised and scheduled for this date on the application of A. E. and A. W. Hammer dba Hammer Drug to transfer their liquor license from 158 Main Street to 524 N. 1st Street. No protests had been filed against this transfer and there was no one present in the audience who protested the change. President McCormick closed the hearing. It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the application be approved and license granted when state license has been received. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

3.2 BEER - FOOD TIME DRIVE-IN GROCERY, INC., 1117 N. 1ST STREET

Hearing had been scheduled and advertised for this date on the application of Food Time Drive-In Grocery, Inc. for a 3.2 beer license at 1117 N. 1st Street. No protests had been filed against this application. A letter was read from Chief of Police Karl Johnson stating his investigation of the applicants had revealed no reason why the license should not be granted. It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the application be approved and license granted when license has been received from the State. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

<u>CANVASS - ELECTION SPECIAL TV FRANCHISE FOR CABLE TV OF COLORADO - 795 FOR AND 1284 AGAINST</u>

A canvass of the vote cast in the Special Municipal Election held January 5, 1965 on the question of granting a franchise to Cable Television Company of Colorado to construct cable television in the City of Grand Junction was made by the City Council. It was moved by Councilman Lowe and seconded by Councilman Wright that the following report be accepted and placed on file. Motion carried. (See next page.)

City Attorney Ashby explained a few items in connection with the election wherein there had been some confusion on who was eligible to vote as taxpayers.

Mr. Tom Mitchell from Cable Television Company of Colorado came to thank the Council publicly for the consideration and treatment given their company in the past election. He said they were not of the opinion that there was anything in this election that would have otherwise determined the outcome. There have been a few small errors but these errors would not have changed the outcome and they have no wish at all to say that they were not fairly treated at the election and took the opportunity to publicly say "good wishes" to the people and the Council of Grand Junction. President McCormick thanked Mr. Mitchell for coming to the Council.

REVOCABLE PERMIT - LITTON WAREHOUSE TO FENCE ALLEY SOUTHWEST CORNER OF 5TH AND SOUTH - Record 2/4/1965-BOOK 879 PAGE 130

The Planning Commission at its meeting of December 30, 1964 recommended the granting of a revocable permit to Litton Warehouse to fence a part of the alley. City Manager Lacy stated that this would be in keeping with the Council's policy in the use of public right of way which is not being used as right of way. Their application for this permit carries the permission in writing of the Public Service Co. and Mt. States Telephone Company. The fence would be located at the southwest corner of the property.

The following Resolution was presented and read:

WHEREAS, such action has been heretofore approved by the City Planning Commission and City Engineer and would not be detrimental to the interest of the inhabitants of the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO:

That the City Manager, on behalf of the City and as the act of the City, be, and he is hereby authorized to grant such revocable permit to the above-named company for the purpose above-stated upon the execution by the company of an agreement to save and hold harmless the City from any claims arising out of the use permitted and agreement that upon he revocation of the permit the Company will restore the right of way to its former condition at the expense of the company.

REVOCABLE PERMIT GRANTED BURKEY LUMBER COMPANY TO ENCROACH 1.8 FEET ONTO 7TH STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR BUILDING FACING

The Planning Commission at its meeting of December 30, 1964 also recommended the granting of a revocable permit to Burkey Lumber Company at 7th and South Avenue. They wish to provide a facing on their building and it will extend 1.8 feet on the 7th Street right of way. City Manager Lacy stated this also follows policy established by the Council. This adds about three inches on their building along 7th Street and the building already extends into the street about 1.3 inches as a result of an old survey.

LEGAL ADVERTISING - CONTRACT WITH DAILY SENTINEL RENEWED

A letter was read from Preston Walker of the Daily Sentinel enclosing a contract for legal advertising for the year 1965 which guarantees legal advertising rates exactly the same as they were in 1964. (15 cents for the first insertion and 11 cents for additional insertions and 10 cents for publication of monthly Receipts & Disbursements). It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Evans that the City Manager be authorized to sign the contract with the Daily Sentinel as submitted. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

PROPOSED ORDINANCE - DOOR TO DOOR SELLING

Two proposed ordinances concerning door to door selling were presented: one entitled AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE LICENSING OF PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS AND TRANSIENT MERCHANTS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF; and the other one entitled AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

A large number of insurance, real estate and door to door sales people was present, protesting the passage of either ordinance. They insisted that the Council repeal the present "Greenriver Ordinance" and urged that they not pass any ordinance regulating door to door selling. After this matter had been discussed for a long period of time, Councilman Meacham asked City Attorney Ashby to draw up an ordinance repealing all of the present Chapter 69 of the 1953 Compiled Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction which pertains to peddling and soliciting in Grand Junction.

REPEAL CHAPTER 69 - PROPOSED ORDINANCE PASSED FOR PUBLICATION

City Attorney Ashby presented and read the following entitled proposed ordinance: AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 69 OF THE 1953 COMPILED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, THE PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS AND ITINERANT MERCHANTS CHAPTER OF SAID ORDINANCES. It was moved by Councilman Meacham and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. The motion carried with Councilman Wright voting NAY. (5 AYES 1 NAY)

PROPOSED ORDINANCE - CODE FOR MOBILE HOME PARKS

A proposed ordinance entitled AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A COMPREHENSIVE CODE FOR THE REGULATION OF MOBILE HOME PARKS; ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR MOBILE HOME SPACES, LOCATION OF SERVICE BUILDINGS, WATER SUPPLY, SEWAGE AND REFUSE DISPOSAL, AND PROVIDING FOR REGISTRATION OF OCCUPANTS, AND PROVIDING FOR COLLECTION OF MOBILE HOME PARK LICENSE FEES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF. It was moved by Councilman Meacham and seconded by Councilman Evans that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 1208 PASSED

The Proof of Publication to the following entitled proposed ordinance

was presented and read: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP, A PART OF CHAPTER 83 OF THE 1953 COMPILED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, BY CHANGING THE ZONING OF CERTAIN LOTS AND PARCELS OF LAND WITHIN THE CITY. It was moved by Councilman Colescott and seconded by Councilman Wright that the proof of publication be accepted and filed. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Colescott that the ordinance be called up for final passage. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

The ordinance was then read, and it was moved by Councilman Evans and seconded by Councilman Wright that the ordinance be passed and adopted, numbered 1208 and ordered published. Roll was called on the motion with all members of the Council present voting AYE. The President declared the motion carried. (6 AYES)

MUNICIPAL JUDGES - CLAY HANLON AND WILLIAM PILGRIM APPOINTED DEPUTY JUDGE

City Manager Lacy read a letter from Municipal Judge Ed Ruland requesting that two deputy municipal judges be appointed to serve when he is out of town or it is not expedient for him to serve. He asked that Mr. Clay Hanlon of the firm of Groves and Nelson and Mr. William Pilgrim of the law firm of Haynie, Golden and Mumby be appointed to serve as deputy municipal judges. It was moved by Councilman Meacham and seconded by Councilman Evans that Mr. Clay Hanlon and Mr. William Pilgrim be appointed to serve as Deputy Municipal Judges. Motion carried. (6 AYES)

<u>ADJOURNMENT</u>

It was moved by Councilman Wright and seconded by Councilman Lowe that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried. (6 AYES)
