#### **MINUTES**

It was moved by Councilman Colescott and seconded by Councilman McCormick that the minutes of the regular meeting held December 15, 1965 be approved as written. Motion carried. (5 AYES)

## **MUNICIPAL JUDGE**

Frank Balderson apptd

Councilman Colescott made a report for the committee appointed to recommend a Municipal Judge. The committee had considered several applicants and wished to present the name of Frank Balderson, 1010 Walnut Ave., as its preference. It was moved by Councilman Colescott and seconded by Councilman McCormick that Frank Balderson, 1010 Walnut Ave., be appointed as Judge of the Municipal Court. Motion carried. (5 AYES)

### LIBRARY BOARD

Barbara Counley apptd to 12-31-68

Councilman Love reported for the committee to suggest someone for a member of the Library Board stating they would recommend Mrs. Richard (Barbara) Counley, 590 Walnut Ave., be appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. Jean Hall who has resigned. It was moved by Councilman Love and seconded by Councilman Otto that the Council approve the appointment of Mrs. Counley as a member of the Library Board to serve to 12-31-68. Motion carried. ## **AIRPORT**

Adopt minimum standards for activities

Members of the Council had been furnished with copies of "Minimum Standards for Commercial Aviation Activities Proposed Be Conducted at Walker Field Adopted by the Walker Field Airport Board December, 1965" which had been considered by the Airport Board on January 3rd. Councilman McCormick stated that these rules had been drawn up by an Airport Board Committee which had considered rules used in other airports over the country. The committee felt the rules were necessary and would provide a guide to the operators and airlines so they would know what they can do at Walker Field. It was moved by Councilman McCormick and seconded by Councilman Love that the action of the Airport Board be ratified and the Minimum Standards for Commercial Aviation Activities Proposed Be Conducted at Walker Field as adopted by the Walker Field Airport Board be adopted. Motion carried. (5 AYES)

# PROP. ORD.

Operation of Gasoline Pumps

The following proposed ordinance entitled AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, BY ADDING THERETO A SECTION 10, COVERING THE OPERATION OF GASOLINE PUMPS WITHIN THE CITY was presented and read. It was moved by Councilman Love and seconded by Councilman McCormick that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication. Motion carried. (5 AYES)

### **AUDITOR FOR 1966**

Committee to select

City Manager Lacy stated that under the new state law, an auditor to audit the records of the City for 1966 should be appointed early in the year so that the records can be checked during the year. President Meacham appointed Councilmen McCormick and Otto to make recommendations for the appointment of an auditor for the year of 1966.

### P.I.A.B.

CA opinion re legal procedure to establish Recreation Dist.

City Manager Lacy stated that at the P.I.A.B. meeting held January 4th, the Board requested that the City Council and County Commissioners instruct their respective attorneys to render a written opinion as to the procedures and legal steps to be taken for a formation of a recreation district and the implications attached to each respective body. This is the first step to area-wide entity that could co-ordinate the many activities which have been sought in the valley. The Council instructed City Attorney Ashby to work with County Attorney Dave Palo in this matter.

## **LEGAL ADVERTISING**

Call for bids

The County Mail and the Daily Sentinel are both wanting to be designated as the City's official advertising newspaper. The Council instructed City Manager Lacy to notify both applicants to have bids in so that they can be considered at the next meeting of the Council.

### **WATER COMMITTEE**

Councilman Colescott reported that the water committee has held several meetings, and they will soon have minutes ready for the Council which will indicate directions in which they plan to carry their improvements.
