ROLL CALL

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, met in regular adjourned session at 7:30 P.M. May 8, 1975, in the Civic Auditorium at City Hall. Members present for roll call: President of the Council, Lawrence Kozisek, Larry Brown, Harry Colescott, Karl Johnson, Jane Quimby, Elvin Tufly, and Robert Van Houten. Also present: City Manager Harvey Rose, City Attorney Gerald Ashby, and City Clerk Neva B. Lockhart.

DISCUSSION

Liquor License at Freeway Bowl

There was discussion of the application by Robert Stack, Freeway Bowl, 1900 Main Street, for a Hotel-Restaurant Liquor License. City Attorney Ashby stated he needs some guidelines from the Council in order to draft Council's decision. Concensus of Council was that the decision should be based on the findings of the City survey and the applicant's survey. The Council discussed Jay's Liquors and other liquor license holders in general who are in violation of the code. It was discussed that there be a change in Council policy whereby it would hold its own hearing and suspend the license if licensees were found to be in violation. President Kozisek suggested that City Attorney Ashby be directed to draft a statement to provide that upon notice from the Police Department of a violation, Council would give notice of hearing within 15 days.

COUNCIL MEMBERS BASKETBALL GAME

For Benefit of Attention to Youth

Council members were to meet at the Mesa College Field House between the hours of 8:00 and 9:00 P.M. Friday, May 9, to participate in a basketball game for the benefit of "Attention to Youth".

SUSPENSION OF CITY EMPLOYEES

City Manager Harvey Rose stated that following a citizen's complaint of May 7, Public Works Director Gus Byrom and Senior Planner Don Warner were suspended effective immediately for two days. He stated they were not rapid and efficient enough to keep this from coming before the Council. It was moved by Councilman Van Houten and seconded by Councilman Johnson to invoke executive session to discuss the situation. Motion carried.

Councilman Van Houten stated that he wished to qualify his motion of May 7, to the effect that the staff have something in writing

that the City has the right to go on the property to start work before the actual purchase of property takes place.

SOUND SYSTEM FOR MULTI-PURPOSE BUILDING

Councilman Van Houten presented the sound system which he would propose for the Multi-Purpose Building. Councilman Van Houten stated that while he was in Japan recently, he had the specifications with him and that he talked with Toa Electric Company, Ltd., and requested they submit a bid on the equipment. Councilman Van Houten stated that he could guarantee the equipment would not cost more than \$18,000 installed. The City would expect delivery by the end of July. It is all standard electronic equipment. The total equipment proposed to be used is as follows:
