#### CERTIFICATE OF ELECTION

We, the undersigned, acting as canvassing board, hereby certify that we have canvassed the returns of the Special Municipal Election held in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, on November 22, 1977, and from the canvass find the results of the election to be as follows:

That 200 ballots were cast in District A

That 234 ballots were cast in District B

That 272 ballots were cast in District C

That 219 ballots were cast in District D

That 206 ballots were cast in District E

That 31 ballots were cast Absentee

That a total of 1,162 ballots were cast in all the districts.

The votes for the ordinance granting the franchise were as follows:

Shall the City of Grand Junction grant a franchise to Public Service Company of Colorado by People's Ordinance No. 32, the title to which shall read:

An Ordinance granting a franchise by the City of Grand Junction to Public Service Company of Colorado, its successors and assigns, to locate, build, construct, acquire, purchase, extend, maintain and operate into, within and through said City of Grand Junction, a plant or plants, substations, and works, for the purchase, manufacture, generation, transmission and distribution of electricity and gas, either natural, artificial or mixed, and to furnish, distribute and sell said electricity and gas to the City of Grand Junction, and the inhabitants thereof, for light, heat

and power or other purposes by means of pipes, mains, conduits, cables, poles and wires strung thereon, or otherwise, on, over, under, along, across and through all streets, alleys, viaducts, bridges, roads, lanes, and other public ways and places in the City of Grand Junction, and authorizing said company, its successors and assigns, to use certain streets and public places for the purpose of furnishing said services; and fixing the terms and conditions thereof if the results of a vote of the qualified electors shall have been determined to have been affirmative for the grant of said franchise.
