Grand Junction, Colorado

September 2, 1981

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, convened in regular session the 2nd day of September, 1981, at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall. Those present were Council members Betsy Clark, Frank Dunn, Dale Hollingsworth, Robert Holmes, Gary Lucero, and President of the Council Louis Brach, a quorum. Also present were City Manager Jim Wysocki, City Attorney Gerald Ashby, and Deputy City clerk Teddy Martinez.

The President of the Council called the meeting to order and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

INVOCATION

Mr. Robert Holmes.

MINUTES

Upon motion by Councilman Dunn, seconded by Councilman Lucero and carried, the minutes of the regular meeting August 19, 1981, were approved as submitted.

APPOINTMENTS TO FORESTRY BOARD

Upon motion by Councilman Hollingsworth, seconded by Councilman Johnson and carried, Del Adolf and Jim Lance were appointed to two-year terms on the Forestry Board, and Ted Kossoudji, Jerry Moore and Roy Winegardner were appointed to three-year terms on the Forestry Board.

PETITION REGARDING CHANGES IN PRIORITIES ON HORIZON DRIVE

Mrs. Beverly Dwire, 2114 Zion Court, representing citizens employed in the area of Horizon Drive, as well as concerned citizens, presented a petition with 502 signatures regarding changes in priorities on Horizon Drive which read as follows: "We, the undersigned tax-paying residents of Mesa County, express our deep concern for the personal safety of all persons who must travel on Horizon Drive. In recognition of this danger and of those persons who have already been injured or killed on this road, we strongly urge the government officials of the City of Grand Junction and of Mesa County to invoke their powers and concerns as elected representatives of the people and take all immediate action necessary to remedy the eminently fatal hazards of Horizon Drive. Necessary improvements include:

- 1. Decreased speed limits;
- 2. More traffic lanes;
- 3. Wider traffic lanes;
- 4. Left turn lanes;
- 5. Stop lights or clearly marked rights-of-way at busy

intersections (7th and Horizon, 12th and Horizon, G Road and Horizon);

- 6. Pedestrian/bicycle pathways;
- 7. Control of parked vehicles on roadside."

Mr. Scott Mitchell, 381 Hillview Drive, spoke siting statistics in terms of accidents in the area, and traffic counts.

Ms. Gail Hubber, 3457 D Road, Palisade, gave some ideas for short and long-term solutions.

Lee Peterson, 501 West Mesa Avenue, spoke on the issue of priorities. He felt that the improvements of Horizon Drive from 1st Street to 7th Street would be "putting the cart before the horse." He felt that the impacted areas of Horizon Drive are from 7th Street to G Road, and that area needs immediate improvements.

Mrs. Dwire expressed her gratitude for being able to express here concerns to Council, and commended the City for the manner in which it is handling the recent energy impact boom.

Mayor Brach informed Mrs. Dwire that the City Council will be scheduling workshops on Horizon Drive beginning next week to discuss Horizon Drive. Public Hearings should begin sometime in October, 1981; said hearings will be published in the local newspaper. A meeting is scheduled on September 9, 1981, to talk with the motel owners and business people operating on Horizon Drive to address parking along Horizon Drive.

INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF THE DISABLED

Mr. Holmes reminded Council of the request for 1981/1982 revenue sharing funds on the part of the Hilltop Independent Resource Center request to be considered for a grant of \$7000 toward its operating budget. Ron Halsey can be reached at 242-8980 regarding the program.

HOUSING AUTHORITY

Mr. Lucero reported on the Housing Authority meeting held on August 28. An additional 50 units in the 800 Block of Main Street are going to be approved, giving the Housing Authority a total of 100 units on that particular property.

PETITION OPPOSING PROPOSED LOCATION OF WAVE POOL

Mayor Brach presented a petition from neighbors in opposition to the proposed location of the Wave Pool at 12th and Gunnison. The petition was signed by 35 individuals and reads as follows: "As neighbors to the proposed wave pool at 12th and Gunnison, we would like to state our opposition to this possible choice of location. We feel that locating such a facility on this site will negatively alter the character of Lincoln Park and the character of our neighborhood. A large commercial venture of this nature is incompatible with the green space flavor of the southeast portion of the park and it will produce unacceptable levels of noise,

traffic and congestion. It will destroy the atmosphere of the neighborhood and send our property values plummeting. We urge you to select a site for the wave pool which will not conflict with residential considerations and which will not despoil a beautiful portion of Lincoln Park." The petition was entered into the record.
