On Tuesday, April 10, 2001, Shaw Construction presented City staff with their Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) based on bids received for Two Rivers Convention Center and parking lot expansion improvements. The following information provides a summary of the two projects cost based on the budget as authorized by City Council. This summary also includes several alternates that Shaw and City staff recommends for inclusion in the GMP. Funding has been identified for all expenditures along with contingencies and funding balances.

Reasons the City is able to consider accepting a number of alternates that were previously discussed with Council is that Sink, Combs, and Dethlefs and Shaw Construction were able to include 75% of the kitchen (\$178,500 est) in the base GMP and the JUCO display was also incorporated into the base GMP. Additionally, Shaw Construction was able to attract favorable bids.

While a number of alternates are being recommended for incorporation into the GMP, there are several that have been deferred including a new dimming control system for the exhibit hall, new HVAC controls for the exhibit hall, electronic flush valves, additional kitchen equipment, and a new roof for the entire existing structure. With the exception of the new roof, it may be possible to include some of these alternates once Shaw Construction completes initial site work without encountering significant "surprises". At the same time, should there be a number of significant change orders, some of the alternates being recommended will not be implemented unless there is a sufficient degree of confidence that all expenses will fall within budgetary allocations already approved. While it would be nice to re-roof the entire facility, the only portion currently failing, is over the kitchen. It is estimated that, with minimal maintenance, the rest of the roof has a remaining life expectancy of 7-10 years.

The other area that impacts the building is operational equipment associated with the addition along with addressing some necessary upgrades to the existing structure. The 2001 budget for Two Rivers has been revised to include: telephone upgrade (\$25,000), furnishings (office, new meeting rooms, including audio visual "LCD", tables, chairs, pipe & drape) (\$66,660), staging and dance floor (\$74,000), facility management software (\$10,000), kitchen equipment (\$11,600), and repair of the redwood door partition in the exhibit hall (\$22,400). This \$209,660 expenditure was previously approved in the 2001 budget by Council but has been adjusted to address more needs directly associated with the renovation. While it will not address all the amenities Two Rivers staff and patrons would like to see, the facility will be fully operational when the facility reopens on or about December 1, 2001.

II. Two Rivers Parking Lot Improvements

The parking lot project for the area adjacent to the Two Rivers Convention Center was originally budgeted at \$1,200,000 over two years (2001 & 2002) and included the acquisition of two properties plus the construction of one large parking lot. Staff is proposing to modify the project based upon additional costs to the project and more importantly, an emphasis of the project to complete all of the elements adjacent to the building. Staff believes this approach will allow future phasing of parking improvements and minimize the disruption to the building in future years. The project is being proposed as follows:

The proposed parking lot project adds some construction items that were not originally anticipated, but does add elements that would make the area adjacent to the building complete, thereby not requiring any future disturbance around the building for future improvements. The addition of the Catfish Restaurant property is not required to meet the strict interpretation of the parking code. However, with the acquisition the parking comes closer to meeting the real parking needs for the Convention Center operations. This proposed approach would delay the acquisition of the Mesa Pawn property to some future date. Staff would propose the specific date be discussed during the update of the 10-year capital plan later this fall.

III. Recommendation

It is recommended that on April 18, 2001 City Council authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Shaw Construction for a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) of \$4,661,292 for the Two Rivers Expansion and Improvements and Two Rivers Parking Lot Improvements. The GMP for Two Rivers Expansion and Improvement is \$3,867,263. The GMP for Two Rivers Parking Lot Improvements is \$794,029. The grand total GMP is \$4,661,292.

- 3. **Ideas, proposals or nominations of monuments/displays** We have received fifteen submittals. Copies of those marked with an "**" are attached.
- (1) Deuteronomy 8 from the New International Version of the Bible (the submittal is unsigned and undated but we have the envelope with the name and address of the contributor) **
- (2) A bas relief sculpture, 1/2 or 1/4 scale replicating those pieces at the U.S. Supreme Court in Washington, D.C. **

- (4) Quotes from Abraham Lincoln and Edmund Burke **
- (5) A packet of copied letters containing no specific suggestion
- (6) A sculpture of a child with the words of Jesus**
- (7) A suggestion to ensure that whatever is placed there expresses the diversity of the population
- (8) A second plaque inscribed with the Bill of Rights**
- (9) A list of monuments such as the Justinian Code, the Magna Carta, the Mayflower Compact, the Declaration of Independence, the Preamble to the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights **

 - (11) A statue of George Washington kneeling at Valley Forge or the Supreme Court Decision of 1892**

Subject: City Council discussion on Volunteer Boards & Commissions

Summary: City Council has asked staff to provide information on the various boards, commissions, committees and authorities whose membership is appointed by City Council including (but not limited to) methods of appointments, qualifications, and authority. Council also asked for recognition suggestions from staff.

Background Information: There are 16 volunteer boards, with 129 members, that City Council oversees. Some boards have full authority to make decisions and spend public funds whereas others were created to provide recommendations to City Council on various issues. Two of the "boards" are actually non-profit corporations created for different purposes, such as incurring debt or owning property. A third non-profit corporation is the Parks Improvement Advisory Board but City Council only appoints a representative. A complete matrix providing specific information on each of these boards is attached.

In 1997, City Council established a written policy on the process of selecting members to the various boards. That policy was amended slightly in 1998 and the amended policy is attached. The Riverfront Commission appointments follow a different procedure since those appointments must happen jointly with Mesa County, the City of Fruita and the Town of Palisade. That procedure is also attached.

Currently, the City Clerk's Office coordinates these appointments by maintaining the records, tracking terms, informing City Council of upcoming vacancies, advertising if so directed, scheduling interviews, preparing letters and certificates and informing candidates of the results. At present, besides personal thank yous appointees receive from individual Councilmembers, the only recognition is a thank you letter and appreciation certificate sent to the member once their term is over. There was a time when plaques were presented but there were mixed opinions over the use of plaques and the practice was discontinued except in special circumstances.

Recently there has been some discussion about how to properly recognize the many people who serve on the City's boards and commissions. One way to do this is to hold an

annual recognition luncheon. All of these volunteers could be invited to a special luncheon with the City Council. An appreciation speech by the Mayor could be given along with a small memento of appreciation such as a pen & pencil set, special mouse pad, etc.

A volunteer board booklet that would give new members an overview of their new position, the duties and responsibilities of the board and a brief review of meeting procedures might be one method of furthering communication with the volunteers on these boards. The City Clerk has several examples of such booklets if the City Council is interested in reviewing them.

Budget: Cost of publishing a booklet would be less than \$500 if done in-house. The cost of a recognition luncheon would be between \$2,500 and \$3,500.

Action Requested/Recommendation: Council discussion and determining changes to be made to the process and procedure for administering boards and commissions.
