
**Background Information:** Code Enforcement is an integral division in assisting all City departments in application of the Zoning and Development Code and several sections of the Municipal Code. The division provides support in enforcement when the activity in question is part of a development process or of a petty criminal/nuisance action that is occurring on private property and is of a non-emergency nature.


As part of the first phase of the Strategic Plan for 2002-2012, Object 9.A set goals in support of The following Solution: **A BALANCE OF CHARACTER, ECONOMY AND ENVIRONMENT.** The objective requested that a team "Review the current code"


requirements and enforcement methods for practicality and take appropriate action." (2 years) Code Enforcement Supervisor, Ivy Williams led out in this objective and a final report was presented to City Council in August, 2003. Council direction at that time was to:


- 1. Recommend language for some changes to sections in the Zoning and Development Code
- Monitor the weed program along with Public Works. Note: The 2005-2006 Strategic Plan Update includes Goal 17: "Evaluate and redefine the problem and level of effort required to manage weeds." Code Enforcement will be support staff in this review headed up by Public Works.


3. Tighten some enforcement procedures for repeat violators Tonight's presentation will update Council on these items and will also summarize and compare the Code Enforcement activities over the last four years.











# 2003 Strategic Plan Review Team Recommendations

- Change certain Zoning and Development Code sections
  - Certain sign code language
  - Amend Landscaping code (maintenance)
- Amend Smoking in Public Places Ordinance
- Review/Change weed ordinance
- Tighten up enforcement on repeating violators of the code.


# Proposed Changes to Zoning and Development Sign Code Section

- Legalize portable signs on areas with similar shopping characteristics such as Main Street (proposed in the 2005 Z&D Code Revisions)
- Require a timeframe for display of campaign related signs (Proposed in revisions)
- Unable to propose changes to off-premise temporary signs such as yard sale, real estate open house and one time sales events.







- Maintenance of new and existing landscaping is required
- The owner of the nearest property is required to keep all rights-of-way that are not hard surfaced, cleared of weeds, litter, junk, rubbish and other obstructions
- Inspections are conducted in follow-up to warranty deeds on some projects.
- 90 days is allowed for replacement of dead landscaping or by the next April if winter.













# Review Team Recommendations for Weeds

- Review Team recommended that Public Works budget for maintaining city owned properties be gradually increased to keep up with anticipated growth.
- Older subdivisions with no HOA should be exempt from the requirement of maintaining rights-of-way outside perimeter fencing
- More discussion needed on maintaining public walking paths, bike paths and trails.





# Goals for 2005

- Maintain current level of service with no additional staff
- Continue Pro-active sign enforcement and add pro-active projects as time allows
- Continue cooperative efforts with Public Works in enforcement related matters including Graffiti, Spring Cleanup, Weeds, Right-of Way trash/junk, and Stormwater management.
- Continue contracting the weed cutting
- Support Community Policing efforts of PD
  - Conduct pro-active inspections as warranted
  - Continue to administer the graffiti contract
