

## Ordinance No. 133.

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An Ordinance concerning Grades and Reestablishing Street Grades  
Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction,  
Colorado;

Sec. I — Datum Established —

That a horizontal plane of reference be and the same is hereby established in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, to which all grades hereafter established or fixed from time to time by the City Council in ordinance for public improvement, or otherwise, shall refer; that the said plane shall be known as City Datum and shall be established at an elevation of 4606.20 feet above sea level, and according to the Government Bench mark, situate upon the North Side of the City Library, within said City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Sec. II — Bench Mark Established —

That the elevation of all other objects described and designated on pages One to Fifteen of folio entitled "Plans and Profiles of Street Grades for the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, prepared by Charles Haskell, City Engineer," adopted by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, at a meeting of the said City Council, held upon October 17th, A. D. 1905, and now in file in the office of the City Clerk, which elevations are thereon given in feet and decimals of a foot above sea level, as herein established, are hereby adopted for the use of the said City to be used in carrying out any public improvement and that such objects shall be known as City Bench mark.

Sec. III — Grades Established —

There is hereby established a system of grades for the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, in the following manner, to wit: The center lines of the streets in said City shall be fixed in elevation above sea level as established herein, by determining the elevation of such lines in feet and tenths of a foot above sea level at the intersection of the center lines of all crossing streets, and of the center lines produced to an intersection of such abutting streets or alleys as may be necessary, and at such other and further defined points in the center lines of the streets of said City as may be desirable. That such center lines shall be straight lines connecting such defined established points.

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Sec. IV - Streets and Side Walks To Conform to Grades

The crown of the streets when improved, and the top line of the curb when set, shall coincide in every case with such center lines so established, and the side walk shall rise towards the lot line from the curb line so established, at the rate of one inch vertically for every three feet in width thereof.

Sec. V - Center line Established

For the purpose of establishing the center line as above described the following points in the said center lines of said streets are and they are hereby established at the following heights above the Sea Level, in feet and tenths of a foot. The figures in the following table, at the intersection of the columns for the respective streets or avenues being taken as the established height for the intersection of the center line of said streets:

In addition to the heights established in the foregoing table, the following list of heights is also hereby established in the center line of the streets or alleys enumerated, and at the points defined, the elevations above Sea Level being given in feet and tenths of a foot as before:

- Elevation of center line of alley through Block 84 — 4603 feet.
- Elevation of center line between lots 23 and 24, Block 62 — 4609 feet.
- Elevation of center line between lots 24 and 25, Block 50 — 4607.8 feet.
- Elevation of center line between lots 23 and 24, Block 49 — 4611 feet.
- Elevation of center line between lots 24 and 25, Block 26 — 4615.6 feet.
