

Ordinance No 146.

An Ordinance Concerning Junk Dealers.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Section I

Any person, persons, firm or corporation, who shall buy, sell, barter, handle, trade or deal in old iron, steel, brass, copper, lead or other metals, or paper, bottles, bones, or other like material shall be deemed Junk Dealers and subject to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section II

Every Junk Dealer shall have a regular place of business within the City of Grand Junction, which place shall be open for inspection to any officer of the City or any citizen of the City when accompanied by an officer of the City, and every such Junk Dealer shall keep at his said place of business a substantial and well bound book in which he shall enter in writing the names and residences of the person or persons from whom he shall purchase or receive any old iron, lead, steel, copper, other materials, rags, bones, bottles, paper or other materials, which said book shall be kept clean and legible, and shall not erase, obliterate or deface any entry therein and shall make all entries therein in ink, and such book shall be open for inspection to any person or persons at all times when accompanied by an officer of the City.

Section III

Every Junk Dealer as defined by and referred to in Section One of this Ordinance shall pay a license tax of Twenty Dollars for a period of one year or Ten Dollars for a period of six months.

Section IV

No Junk Dealer as defined by this Ordinance shall, within the lines of his business as such have any dealings directly or indirectly with any minor unless he shall have first obtained permission in writing from the parent or guardian of such minor, so to do, nor with any intoxicated person.

Section V

Any person violating, failing, neglecting, or refusing to comply with the provisions, regulations and requirements of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars.
