

Ordinance No. 175

An Ordinance Providing for the Temporary Appointment of a Judge of the Municipal Court.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1 That in case of the temporary absence, sickness or other inability of the Judge of the Municipal Court to act, the Mayor may appoint some competent person to act as such Judge of the Municipal Court, and such appointments must be in writing, and in such case the person so appointed, shall act in the place and stead of such Judge of the Municipal Court, until the disability of such Judge of the Municipal Court is removed. The Judge of the Municipal Court so appointed shall have all the jurisdiction, powers, duties and limitations of a Judge of the Municipal Court as provided in the Charter of the City of Grand Junction.

Sec. 2. Such temporary Judge of the Municipal Court shall receive, as compensation while so engaged, a salary at the rate of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per month, and such fees as are now, or may hereafter be provided by law for Justices of the Peace for like services in the County of Mesa; provided, in no case shall such fees be paid by the City of Grand Junction.

Passed and adopted by a unanimous vote of the City Council this 10<sup>th</sup> day of February, A. D. 1910.

I hereby certify that the foregoing Ordinance, entitled, "An Ordinance Providing for the Temporary Appointment of a Judge of the Municipal Court," was introduced and read at a special adjourned meeting of the City Council held on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1910; that the same was ordered published once in full in a daily newspaper of the city; and that, whereas, owing to the expected temporary absence from the city at the same time of <sup>Mayor</sup> Thomas M. Todd, ex-officio Judge of the Municipal Court, and of Commissioner B. W. Vedder, who would become acting mayor and ex-officio Judge of the Municipal Court, during the absence of Mayor Thos. M. Todd, the city will be without the services of a Judge of the Municipal Court, a case of special emergency for the preservation of the public peace will exist during the absence of Mayor Thos. M. Todd and Commissioner B. W. Vedder; therefore, it was resolved by the City Council that the above ordinance be passed as an emergency ordinance and go into effect at once; and that the above ordinance was passed and adopted by a unanimous vote of the Council at a special adjourned meeting held on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1910.
