

Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado

ORDINANCE NO. 191.

AN ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO SPIRITOUS, VINOUS, MALT, FERMENTED, DISTILLED, ALCOHOLIC, OR ANY INTOXICATING LIQUORS.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1. No person shall, either as principal, agent, clerk, servant or otherwise, directly or indirectly, sell, expose for sale, barter, exchange, give away, or manufacture within the corporate limits of the City of Grand Junction, or within one mile of the outer boundaries thereof, any spiritous, vinous, malt, fermented, distilled, alcoholic or any intoxicating liquors; said giving away shall not apply to the giving away of any of the said spiritous, vinous, malt, fermented, distilled, alcoholic or any intoxicating liquors by a person in his private dwelling, provided such private dwelling is not a place of public resort. The soliciting or the taking of any order for the sale or delivery of any such liquor shall be held to be an unlawful selling within the meaning of this section.

Sec. 2. No person shall, either as principal, agent, clerk, servant, or otherwise, store, keep or possess within the corporate limits of the city of Grand Junction, any spiritous, vinous, malt, fermented, distilled or any intoxicating liquors with intent to sell, barter, exchange or give away the same in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. No person, either as principal, agent, clerk, servant or otherwise, who keeps within the city of Grand Junction, any barroom, saloon, restaurant, eating house, grocery, drug store, coffee house, or other place of public resort, shall suffer or permit any spiritous, vinous, malt, fermented, distilled, alcoholic or any intoxicating liquors to be drunk, in any manner whatsoever, in such barroom, saloon, restaurant, eating house, grocery, drug store, coffee house or other place of public resort.

Sec. 4. It shall be a good defense in any prosecution, under this ordinance, to show that the sale in question was at retail, by a regularly licensed pharmacist, for exclusively known medicinal purposes, and that it was sold only in good faith upon the written prescription, issued, signed and dated in good faith, by a duly licensed physician in active practice, and that the prescription was used but once.

Sec. 5. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$200. or by imprisonment in the County Jail not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
