## Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado

ORDINANCE NO. 201.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE VI OF ORDINANCE 92, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING WATER WORKS, AND TO REPEAL CERTAIN OTHER ORDINANCES," PASSED AND ADOFTED FEBRUARY 19, 1900.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

That Section 1 of Article VI of Ordinance No. 92, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Works, and to Repeal Certain other Ordinances, passed and adopted the 19th day of February, 1900," be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. No tap inserted in the street mains for the purpose of connection with the service pipe shall have an orifice of a greater diameter than five-eighths of an inch. Every such tap shall be of brass and shall connect with a heavy lead pipe known as "Double Extra Heavy," which lead pipe shall extend at least to the stop box. All service pipes and their fixtures connected with the water mains shall be well and substantially made, and the laying of such pipes and all work done in conducting water from the mains to and upon the premises shall be done in a skillful and workmanlike manner, and such pipes shall be laid at least four feet deep in the ground, so that the water therein shall not be affected by the frost. Whenever lead service pipe as herein provided for are now laid, or shall be hereafter laid, the city of Grand Junction shall maintain the same from the city mains to the stop boxes, but the original cost of laying the lead pipe as herein provided for shall be borne by the adjoining property owner or other person desiring the work done.

Provided, however, that where the pipe running from the street mains to the stop boxes as now laid is of other material than lead, such pipe may continue in use until it leaks, at which time it must be replaced by lead pipe as herein provided.
