

Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado

ORDINANCE NO. 220.

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING LUMBER YARDS AND WOOD YARDS WITHIN THE FIRE LIMITS.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1. No lumber yard or wood yard for the sale or storage of lumber or wood shall be kept or maintained upon any premises within the fire limits of the City of Grand Junction.

Sec. 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense, and each day the violation continues after notice by the city authorities shall constitute a separate offense.

Sec. 3. In the opinion of the City Council, a case of special emergency exists for the preservation of the public safety; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
