Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado

ORDINANCE NO. 222.

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING WATER WORKS.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Section 1. No tap inserted in the street water mains shall have a greater diameter than five-eighths of an inch, and every tap shall be of brass. The service pipe shall be of lead or galvanized iron pipe, and all pipe shall be laid in a skillful and workmanlike manner and shall not be less than four feet in the ground.

Sec. 2. If the service pipe be of galvanized iron, the lead pipe for connection shall not be less than eighteen inches in length, and shall be wiped to brass solder nipple to tap coupling. If the service pipe be of lead, it shall be pipe known as double extra heavy lead pipe.

When lead pipe is laid as provided in section 2 of this ordinance, the City shall maintain the same, but the original cost shall be borne by the adjoining property owner or person desiring the work done. When galvanized iron pipe is laid, the adjoining property owner shall maintain the same.

Sec. 4. When the service pipe shall become defective and leak, it shall be reported to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, who shall make inspection of the same, and if the pipe be worn out, he shall order it replaced with new pipe. If the pipe be in a generally good condition, he may permit a licensed plumber to repair the leak.

Sec. 5. Ordinance No. 201, passed and adopted November 12th, 1912, is hereby repealed.
