

Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado

ORDINANCE NO. 228.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO WATER RENTS.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1. Whenever a water user notifies the Commissioner of Water and Sewers of a desire to have the water shut off his premises because of vacancy therein, the city shall cause the water to be shut off such premises at the curb stop box, and a credit shall be given on the books of the city to such water user for said premises for the period of time water is so shut off.

No credit shall be given to any water user for vacancies in his premises unless the water shall be shut off as provided herein.

Section 2. Where a water user desires water for the use of lawn only, when the house or other buildings are vacant, he shall be charged for water for such lawn use the minimum rate for house service.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective and be in full force and effect on and after October 1st, 1914.
