

Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado

ORDINANCE NO. 229.

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1. There shall be appointed for general municipal elections in each election precinct where at the last preceding general election there were cast three hundred or more votes, three judges of election and two clerks to supervise the casting of the ballots to be known as receiving judges and clerks, and three judges and two clerks to canvass and make returns of the ballots cast at said election to be known as counting judges and clerks. By general municipal elections shall be meant as defined in Section 3, Article 2, of the Charter of said city.

Sec. 2. The City Council shall provide the judges of election of each precinct where two sets of judges are appointed with a double number of ballot boxes .

Sec. 3. An election where two sets of judges and clerks are appointed shall be conducted and the returns made in the same manner as is provided in Sections 7, 8, and 9, in an act of the General Assembly of the State of Colorado, approved May 14, 1913, said act being entitled "An Act in Relation to Elections in the State of Colorado."

Sec. 4. The City Council may provide a separate room or building for the counting judges, but whenever ballot boxes are moved from one room or building to another they shall be under the constant observation of at least one of said counting judges.

Sec. 5. At all special municipal elections as defined by Section 3, Article 2, of the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, the election shall be conducted and the ballots counted and the returns made by one set of election officials for each precinct, said officials consisting of three judges and two clerks.
