## ORDINANCE NO. 266

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THEATRES.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Section 1. The terms and provisions of Sections 9, 10, 11 and 21 of Ordinance No. 227, passed and adopted July 14, 1914, shall not apply to buildings already constructed used for theatrical or operatic purposes, for a period of one year next after the going into effect of this ordinance; provided, such building shall be made to comply with said Ordinance No. 227 in all other respects, and that the Mayor and the Chief of the Fire Department, after inspecting such building, shall authorize such building to be run for theatrical and operatic purposes.
