MINUTES

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 4, 2012, 2:00 P.M.

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting convened at 2:00 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Mike Grattan, City Attorney John Shaver, and Deputy City Clerk Debbie Kemp.

II. APPLICATIONS TO RENEW LIQUOR AND BEER LICENSES

1. Feather Petroleum Company, dba Stop N Save No. Three, 723 Horizon Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81506, 3.2% Beer Retail (Off Premises)

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Feather Petroleum Company, dba Stop N Save No. Three was found to be in order and approved.

2. Brinker Restaurant Corporation dba Chili's Grill & Bar, 584 24 ½ Road, Grand Junction, CO 81505, Hotel and Restaurant

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Brinker Restaurant Corporation dba Chili's Grill & Bar was found to be in order and approved.

3. Los Reyes Restaurant, Inc., dba Los Reyes Restaurant, 811 S. 7th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Hotel and Restaurant

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Los Reyes Restaurant, Inc., dba Los Reyes Restaurant was found to be in order and approved.

III. APPLICATION FOR A CHANGE IN CORPORATE STRUCTURE

1. Grand International Buffet, Inc., dba Grand International Buffet, 2504 Hwy. 6 & 50, Ste. 500, Grand Junction, CO 81505-7170, Beer and Wine

President: Cheng Le Lin, 669 Alexia Court, Grand Junction, CO 81505 replaces Yun Hui Lu

No one was present representing the applicant.

Ms. Kemp advised that reports from CBI/FBI are pending on the new owner. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Kemp if this item shouldn't be a transfer of ownership instead of change in corporate structure. Ms. Kemp advised that Mr. Cheng Le Lin purchased 100% of the stock in Grand International Buffet, Inc.

The application for change in corporate structure for Grand International Buffet, Inc., dba Grand International Buffet was found to be in order and approved subject satisfactory reports from CBI/FBI.

IV. APPLICATION FOR AN ART GALLERY PERMIT

 Hang Ups of Grand Junction, LLC dba Kurtzman/Lintott Gallery, 412 Main Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501

John Lintott, co-owner of Kurtzman/Lintott Gallery, was present.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Lintott if the gallery has been in business previously and is just now applying for liquor service. Mr. Lintott said that they have been in business and are moving from 209 Colorado Avenue to 412 Main Street and decided that they would apply for a liquor permit so that they could serve wine at their openings.

Mr. Lintott stated that the only time they would be serving wine will be at the first Friday openings.

Hearing Officer Grattan entered the art gallery permit application into the record as Exhibit A.

The application for an art gallery permit for Hang Ups of Grand Junction, LLC dba Kurtzman/Lintott Gallery was found to be in order and approved.

V. APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL EVENTS PERMIT

1. Colorado Mesa University Foundation, 1450 N. 12th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, "Grand Junction Rockestra" on January 21, 2012 from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., 1100 North Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Malt, Vinous, and Spirituous

Pres./Sec'y.: Keith Gilstrap, P.O. Box 781, New Castle, CO 81647 Event Manager: Rick Taggart, 455 Seasons Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81507

Rick Taggert, Chief Executive Officer for Colorado Mesa University Foundation, was present.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Taggert to explain the diagram that was provided with the application and entered into the record as Exhibit A. Mr. Taggert said that it is a schematic of the Moss Performing Arts Center. He identified the area that is outlined that will be the restricted area for alcohol beverages. The advised that at the entrance of the room where alcohol beverages will be served will be where identification will be checked and

patrons will be banded to show that they are of age to drink alcohol. The bartenders will also be asking for identification. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Taggert if the black outline on the diagram is the limits of the alcohol service area which does not include the theatre proper for alcohol consumption. Mr. Taggert confirmed that to be correct. City Attorney Shaver asked what the "security point, doors, and main entrance" mean on the diagram. Mr. Taggert stated that will be where the volunteers that are TIP's trained will be posted to inspect and make sure no alcohol leaves the facility.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Taggert if he is familiar with the document called Special Event Permit Questionnaire Affidavit and if so, who signed the document? Mr. Taggert said he is familiar with that document and that he is the one who signed it. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Taggert if, by that signature, he is representing to the Authority that the information contained in the questionnaire is true and correct. Mr. Taggert said yes.

Mr. Taggert advised the Authority that they appreciate them looking at this on their behalf.

The application for a special events permit at the Moss Performing Arts Center for Colorado Mesa University Foundation was found to be in order and approved.

VI. APPLICATION FOR NEW LICENSE – RESOLUTION AND FINDINGS AND DECISION

 The Palette, dba The Palette, 205 Colorado Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Beer and Wine

President/Owner: Claire M. Meil, 1357 Orchard Avenue, Grand Junction, CO

81501

Claire Meil, Owner of The Palette, was present.

Hearing Authority Grattan asked Ms. Meil what type of entity is The Palette. Ms. Meil stated that it is an S-Corp.

Ms. Kemp reported that the report on the FBI investigation is still pending on the owner and that a report from the Health Department is pending final inspection.

Ms. Kemp read the results of the survey that was conducted into the record (see attached).

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Meil if the results of the survey that were read were true and accurate. Ms. Meil said yes. City Attorney Shaver asked who conducted the survey. Ms. Meil said that she did, along with her father and her mother. City Attorney Shaver asked why there were so few respondents for residential. Ms. Meil said that it was hard to find people that would answer or actually lived in the defined area. Many of the homes were boarded up or not lived in. Most of the residential signatures were obtained in the Riverside area.

City Attorney Shaver asked when they encountered homes where people were not at home or only under age people were present, if they went back. Ms. Meil stated that they did go back one time and were unsuccessful in obtaining more signatures. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Meil to describe the nature of the business that she is applying for a beer and wine license. Ms. Meil said that it will be a working art studio with instructors that will teach art classes and the purpose for having beer and wine is to make it more of an event or an outing for people to go. It will provide a little bit more for the class. City Attorney Shaver asked if there will be food. Ms. Meil said that they will have chips, crackers, cheese, turkey, salami, and other appetizer type foods.

Hearing Officer Grattan made note that there was no one present in opposition of the application. He did note that the number of business contacts on the survey was very high and the residential number is very low. He asked where Chuluota Avenue is. City Attorney Shaver stated that it is in the Riverside area. He acknowledged that almost all of the boundary area is business, except the Riverside area. He finds that the survey results were sufficient due to the nature of the neighborhood.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked City Attorney Shaver if he recollects that the food would be sufficient according to the Statutes. City Attorney Shaver said that it would be sufficient.

City Attorney Shaver recommended approval of the beer and wine license application because the evidence shows the fact that there was a significant effort obtaining signatures with the businesses in the neighborhood. Those businesses are clearly in favor of the issuance of the license and there are a limited number of beer and wine licenses in the area.

The application for a new beer and wine license for The Palette dba The Palette was found to be in order and approved conditioned on satisfactory reports from FBI on the owner and from the Health Department. The City Clerk's office will prepare a resolution for Hearing Officer Grattan's signature.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS

There was none.



SUBJECT: Application for a new beer and wine liquor license by The Palette

dba The Palette, 205 Colorado Avenue, Grand Junction, CO

The Palette filed an application with the Local Licensing Authority on December 2, 2011for a new beer and wine liquor license permitting sales of malt and vinous liquors and fermented malt beverages by the drink for consumption on the premises at 205 Colorado Avenue under the trade name of The Palette. The application and supplementary documents were reviewed, found to be in order and accepted. A copy was sent to the State Liquor Enforcement Division for a Concurrent Review. The hearing date was set for January 4, 2012. The Notice of Hearing was given by posting a sign on the property on or before December 25, 2011 and by publishing a display ad in the Daily Sentinel on December 23, 2011.

In order to address the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood and the desires of the adult inhabitants of the neighborhood, the applicant conducted a survey. The neighborhood was defined as the area bounded on the North by Grand Avenue, Hale Avenue on the South, N. 5th Street on the East and Chuluota Avenue on the West and includes both sides of the streets as the outer boundaries. The results of that survey are as follows:

No letters of opposition or counterpetitions have been filed to date.

There were 5 responses that were disqualified because one listed an address that does not exist in the City Limits, one listed an address that wasn't a residence and they weren't a business owner or a manager, one listed an address that was outside the defined survey area, and 2 business responses were disqualified because the signers also signed as a resident.

There were three "exhibit to survey petition" sheets (attached) that were provided by the circulators of the survey with various reasons for not signing the survey forms.

The Grand Junction Police Department has investigated the owner for local criminal history. The Police Department will be inspecting the property to ensure the Notice of Hearing has been posted in a timely manner and verifying that the diagram matches the establishment. The fingerprints have been forwarded to CBI for further processing. Reports have been requested from the Grand Junction Fire Department, Mesa County Health Department, and City of Grand Junction Sales Tax Department.

The number of similar-type outlets in the survey area is as follows:

Beer and Wine – 2 – Smashburgers (recently closed) and Pablo's Pizza
