- Downloadable walking/driving tours It was suggested that these could be created in Google Earth with little or no cost involved. Kristen will research.
- Participate in the Downtown Operation Foresights 50th Anniversary celebration. The event may be happening in May which could correspond with Historic Preservation Month. Kristen and Kathy Jordan will try to find out who in the community is heading up the effort and determine how the Board could become involved.
- Kristen will continue working on the historic preservation page for the new City web site

Updates. PJ McGovern reported that the building south of the railroad depot is now bank owned and perhaps there were some opportunities to coordinate redevelopment of the area around both buildings.

Kathy reported that the St. Joseph Church is thinking of demolishing the old church building that is now used as the parish hall. A structural report has been prepared for it and both the roof and floor are experiencing movement. The Board agreed it would be good to look into whether the building could be designated so that it would be eligible for grant funds to help with the stabilization work. Kristen and Kathy will research the status.
