AIRPORT STUDY COMMITTEE MEETING:

July 31, 1967

Present were Paul Heidel, Ed McCormich, Ed Lamm, Clyde Lowe, W.J. Anderies and Gus Byrom. Also present were Bob Van-Houghton and Ron Duff of the Delta Products.

Gus Byrom presented both the gentlemen of Delta Products. They wish to explore the possibility of locating their Industrial Complex on the Airport property. Gus Byrom indicated that the Airport Board had never formulated any policy concerning Industrial development of the Airport.

Paul Heidel asked Ron Duff why they wanted to locate at the Airport. Since they were in the electrical Instrument business, they therefore wished to be in close proximity to the Airport. Also, so they could test their instruments. Since they shipped a lot of their material by air and do a lot of research and development connected with flying, a site on the Airport property would save them a lot of money.

Ron Duff indicated that they would need from two to five acres, but their primary needs would be in the vicinity of 15,000 square feet, which they could expand to 45,000 square feet.

Gus Byrom suggested that we obtain a copy of the lease documents for Jefferson County Airport.

The Study Committee agreed to get together and study this matter further.
