Summary:

1/5 – 556 29 ½ Road – 911 hang-up, could hear female screaming for help and male saying he would resist/fight, MCSO responded and took one male in to custody after a short attempt to hide & escape; 725 South 5th Street – Thermo Fluids - structure fire in the paneling of building, GJFD was able to extinguish before any explosions occurred.

1/6 – Glade Park – area of Creek Canyon Road – Gyroplane crashed, very remote area, 2 occupants located by SMH CareFlight and recovered by SARC via snowmobile; 35 Road & E Road – one vehicle rollover, no injuries reported.

1/14 – 482 Melody Lane – 29 year old male stabbed his father and grandfather, GJPD responded and took one male in to custody.

1/18 – 445 Chipeta #16 – Officers responded to a verbal disturbance then heard shots fired, male advised he was shot, GJFD transported one patient to SMH C2, suspect was not immediately detained; 28 ¼ Road & Patterson – vehicle crashed, suspect fled in vehicle on to CMU campus, crashed on campus where 4 suspects fled, 2 were detained; 141 N 1st Street - Rodeway Inn – several subjects assaulting

an 18 year old female, one male was arrested, one female taken to SMH for a psych evaluation.

1/20 - 551 Kokopelli Drive – Kokopelli Urgent Care – male brandished a gun and tried to take a subjects wallet, suspect left scene and was not immediately detained; 3350 Front Street – Vehicle was hit by a train while pulling in to the driveway of the address, driver was not injured;

1/25 – South Elm & Highway 6 – semi truck vs. power lines, driver had to wait for Xcel to get on scene before he could exit the truck, no injuries; 32 Road & F Road – large truck drove up on sidewalk and over two elderly people, 74 year old female was taken to SMH C3 with ankle injuries, 76 year old male taken to SMH C2 with open femur fracture; 32 Road & I-70 B – 2 vehicle crash, one male patient taken to SMH C2.

1/27 – 32 1/8 Road & E Road – robbery/suspicious incident – armed suspect stole cigarettes and money from an individual, left the scene in a vehicle; 32 & E Road - a different RP called in a suspicious incident relating to the earlier robbery stating a man matching the suspect description insisted giving the RP a ride in a vehicle matching the description from earlier incident, showed him a gun but did not threaten the RP, dropped the RP off at a different location, MCSO located the suspect, recovered the vehicle and weapon involved.

1/29 – Bait Xbox was taken, Investigators successfully tracked it to Monument Hall, took one male in to custody who was also C10 out of Denver.

1/30 – Spin City – juvenile felony menacing – one juvenile male threatened another with a knife, was taken in to custody.

1/31 – Several fights during and after MMA cage wars; Days Inn – Horizon Drive – RP went to the hotel for a ‘massage’, the female at the address answered the door in undergarments and the RP saw drug paraphernalia and left, RP claims he did not intend on paying for anything more than a ‘massage’.

Summary (crime scenes activity, court appearances, complex cases, use of resources, problems or unusual events):

Fruita Police Department requested assistance from our Forensic Investigators to help process the scene of a homicide. The Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) did not have any Crime Scene Investigators available locally. We sent three employees to the scene and one employee to process the suspect at the hospital.

We received a TruNarc handheld narcotics identification system from CBI. The TruNarc is on loan to the department for 6 months while the device is evaluated. It will be used by the Street Crimes unit. What makes the TruNarc unit unique is its ability to scan and detect drugs through a plastic bag. The Officer does not need to handle the suspect drugs as they would with traditional chemical tests. This device retails for around \$20,000.
