## Summary:

**2/1** – 2993 North Avenue, Central Station – ALARMB, male suspect kicked in the door, was found with a handgun and taken in to custody.

**2/7** – Stolen vehicle was found in the parking lot of Motel 6, male suspect with a lengthy criminal history was not at the location, warrant issued; 1425 N 15<sup>th</sup> Street – FELMEN, male suspect pulled a knife on two roommates, one male roommate got away, one female roommate had to exit through a bedroom window, suspect was taken in to custody without incident; 3280 Columba Drive – ASSLT, boyfriend assaulted RP, broke her wrist and left address, was found & taken in to custody shortly after; 502 32 ½ Road – FELMEN, 15 year old RP reported her stepfather was holding an AK to her mother's head, RP hid in 4 year old sisters bedroom while Deputies talked to the suspect through the door until he became cooperative and came out of the house and was taken in to custody, loaded gun left sitting on the couch.

**2/10** – Chatfield Elementary was evacuated for a gas leak, leak was located and repaired, Clifton Fire examined seven children for possible exposure.

**2/15** – No Thoroughfare Canyon/Monument Road – MC Search & Rescue responded to an adult male hiker stranded on a cliff, rescued without incident; 1722 Rood Avenue – large fight with 6-8 males, subjects fled down an alley, but were later contacted; 718 Horizon Drive – Travelodge - large fight with 10-20 adults, all subjects left before law enforcement arrived.

**2/17** – 1150 N 25<sup>th</sup> Street – Native Ink – Street Crimes called out SWAT on a possible Code 6, four subjects were removed from the building and detained without incident; 3246 ½ Downey Ct #2 – 28 year old female went in to labor at home, water broke and baby was crowning, the dispatcher aided the RP through a successful delivery; Clifton Fire arrived shortly after and transported mom and baby to St. Mary's.

**2/19** – 411 Canyon Trail – MCSO, SWAT and DTF executed a search warrant without incident;

**2/20** – Mountain Vista – fight with multiple family members, one non-relative female was punched then punched a window and cut her arm, transported to St. Mary's.

**2/21** – 3210 Opal Court (4 Plex) – Structure Fire, 15 people and 2 cats displaced; 497 28 ½ Road – Guardian Storage – Structure Fire, 2 fatalities, pipe bombs found and BOMB squad was paged out; SARC called out for 2 lost hikers north of Palisade; SARC called out to the Uncompaghre for 2 males whose vehicle got stuck on unknown road and they tried to walk out; GJPD followed & stopped an armed and dangerous subject from Garfield County near Nisley Elementary, male subject was taken in to custody; 464 Coos Bay Street – FELMEN – 14 year old male pulled a knife on RP, subject was taken in to custody without incident.

### Citizen Complaint

#### Code of Conduct violation

2/2/2015 2015-00015 Citizen claims officers violated her civil rights by taking her into protective custody, under her mistaken belief Colorado law protects her right to commit suicide.

Employee 1-3 Unfounded *Officers acted appropriately. The citizen is mistaken about the law.*

2/9/2015 2015-00024 Citizen alleges an officer harassed him when he was stopped for speeding but not given a ticket for speeding. He also alleged officer used unprofessional language.

Employee 1 Sustained *No basis for the harassment allegation. Officer should have refrained from calling the citizen "tough guy."*

2/22/2015 2015-00025 Citizen alleged an officer was rude and condescending while investigating a disorderly conduct incident.

Employee 1 Unfounded *The allegation is not supported by the facts of what happened.*

### Department review      **Traffic accident**

2/13/2015 2015-00029 Officer responding code 3 to assist another officer was in a minor damage accident.

Employee 1 Followed policy *Officer complied with policy.*

### **Use of force**

2/4/2015 2015-00018 Suspect had a warrant for his arrest. When officer tried to handcuff him, the suspect ran away on foot. Taser was deployed but missed. Second officer went hands on and took suspect to the ground. A Taser drive stun was used to gain compliance of suspect who was still struggling with the officers.

2/9/2015	2015-00022	Suspect with warrant for his arrest fled on foot from officers. After a foot chase a Taser was used to overcome the resistance to being arrested.	
Employee	1	Followed policy	<i>Use of Taser followed training and policy.</i>
2/16/2015	2015-00023	Suspect fled on foot from a stolen car. After a short foot chase the suspect continued to resist and was Tased and hit with a baton. Officers then got him under control.

Employee	2	Followed policy	<i>Use of baton followed training and policy.</i>
2/18/2015	2015-00026	Subject physically resisted a lawful detention and officers had to use hands on control techniques to restrain her.	
Employee	1	Followed policy	<i>Use of force followed training and policy.</i>
2/18/2015	2015-00031	Suspect actively resisted being taken into custody. Officer went hands on to control the suspect, taking her to the ground. Suspect sustained minor injury.	
Employee	1	Followed policy	<i>Use of force followed training and policy. Verbal skills could have been utilized to a greater extent.</i>
