HEARING OFFICER MICHAEL GRATTAN

I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Mike Grattan, City Attorney John Shaver, and Deputy City Clerk Juanita Peterson.

II. APPLICATION TO RENEW LIQUOR AND BEER LICENSES

1. Grand Junction Regional Airport Authority dba Grand Junction Regional Airport Authority, 2828 Walker Field Dr., Airport Terminal Building, Second Floor, Grand Junction, CO 81506, Hotel and Restaurant

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Grand Junction Regional Airport Authority dba Grand Junction Regional Airport Authority was found to be in order and approved.

2. City of Grand Junction dba Lincoln Park Sports Complex, 1307 North Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Tavern

Larry Manchester, Recreation Supervisor, was present.

The application for renewal for the City of Grand Junction dba Lincoln Park Sports Complex, 1307 North Avenue was found to be in order and approved.

3. Bank 8 Billiards, Inc. dba Bank 8 Billiards, 2460 Patterson Unit #3, Grand Junction, CO 81505, Tavern

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Bank 8 Billiards, Inc. dba Bank 8 Billards was found to be in order and approved.

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal with outdoor dining lease for Nepal Restaurant GJ, LLC dba Nepal Restaurant was found to be in order and approved.

IV. APPLICATIONS FOR A TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

Ms. Amy Hampton, General Manager, was present.

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Hampton to explain the purpose of the transfer. Ms. Hampton said it was an asset purchase, but everything else will remain the same as it currently is. She is the current registered manager at Residence Inn, and the registered manager at the Courtyard will also remain the same.

Ms. Peterson reported all the paperwork is in order and all reports are in compliance except C.B.I./F.B.I. which is pending on the two local managers. There is a Master File in Denver that has been accepted by the State. This is an asset purchase and White Lodging Services will continue as the lessee for SSH TRS M.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked City Attorney Shaver if he had any objections. City Attorney Shaver said he did not and recommends approval.

Hearing Officer Grattan approved the transfer of the hotel and restaurant liquor license for SSH TRS M and White Lodging Services Corporation, LLC dba Residence Inn Grand Junction contingent on a satisfactory background report on the local manager.

2. RLJ II-C Grand Junction Lessee LLC and White Lodging Services to SSH TRS M and White Lodging Services Corporation dba Courtyard by Marriott Grand Junction, 765 Horizon Drive, Grand Junction, Colorado 81506, Tavern

Ms. Amy Hampton, General Manager for Residence Inn was present to represent this application also.

Ms. Hampton said this is the same for this property as for the previous one. Everything will remain the same.

City Attorney Shaver said he had no objections to the transfer of ownership.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone present who objected to either of these transfers. Seeing no one, Hearing Officer Grattan approved the transfer of the hotel and restaurant liquor license for SSH TRS M and White Lodging Services Corporation dba Courtyard by Marriott Grand Junction contingent on a satisfactory background report on the local manager.

Ms. Peterson reported the paperwork was in order and all reports are in compliance.

Ms. Jennifer Grossheim Harris, event manager, was present. Ms. Harris also stated she is the director of marketing for Habitat for Humanity.

City Attorney Shaver handed Ms. Harris three pages. The first two pages were marked with an "A" in the upper right hand corner and the next document with a "B" (see attached). City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Harris if she is familiar with these documents. She answered yes, that she completed these documents. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Harris who's signature that was on the second page of Exhibit A. She said it was hers. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Harris to describe the event. Ms. Harris said this would be the first time for this event for them. They want to introduce folks to the ReStore, this reception is in conjunction with the two day "2015 Women Build" event. It is by invite only and is a fundraiser for them. They will limit it to approximately 50 people.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked about the security for the event. Ms. Harris described that there will be one off-duty police officer from DeBeque at the door checking ID's. They will also rely on volunteers of Habitat for serving and monitoring levels of intoxication.

City Attorney Shaver said he would recommend approval and entered the Exhibits into the record.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone present who is in favor or against this request. Hearing Officer Grattan found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there were no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, and its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for a special event permit submitted by Habitat for Humanity ReStore was in order and approved it.

Jesse Daniels, event manager, was present.

Ms. Peterson reported the paperwork was in order and all reports are in compliance.

City Attorney Shaver handed Mr. Daniels three pages. The first two pages were marked with an "A" in the upper right hand corner and the next document with a "B" (see attached). City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Daniels if he is familiar with these documents. He answered yes, that he completed these documents. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Daniels whose signature was on the second page of Exhibit A. He said it was his. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Daniels to describe the event. Mr. Daniels said this would be the third year, but the first time for this event at this location, M City Lounge. They are hoping to have 3 days of the event inside and the 4th day outside as per the diagram (see attached).

Hearing Officer Grattan asked Mr. Daniels about the security. Mr. Daniels said M City Lounge who they are renting the event site from will be providing security, and there will be 4-10 security persons on hand depending on the time and number in attendance. Security will check ID's at the door and over 21 will be wrist banded, under 21 will have a black "x" on their hands. Hearing Officer Grattan asked how the intoxication of attendees will be monitored. Mr. Daniels said by himself, the event manager, the bartenders, staff, and security.

City Attorney Shaver said he would recommend approval and entered the Exhibits into the record.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone present who is in favor or against this request. Hearing Officer Grattan found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there were no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, and its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for a special event permit submitted by Colorado West Pride was in order and approved it.

4. Mesa County Public Library Foundation, P.O. Box 3668, Grand Junction, CO 81502 - First Friday Art Reception on May 1 & November 6, 2015 – 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. – at 443 North 6th Street, Grand Junction, Malt, Vinous, and Spirituous

Karen Kllanxhja, event manager, was present.

Ms. Peterson reported the paperwork was in order and all reports are in compliance.

City Attorney Shaver handed Ms. Kllanxhja three pages. The first two pages were marked with an "A" in the upper right hand corner and the next document with a "B" (see attached). City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Kllanxhja if she is familiar with these documents. She answered yes, that she completed these documents. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Kllanxhja whose signature that was on the second page of Exhibit A. She said it was the Director of the Library, Mr. Sanchez. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Kllanxhja to describe the event. Ms. Kllanxhja said they have held this for three years, but this is the first year they would have alcohol at their event. They are expecting between 50 – 120 people and they will only have the east entrance of the library open, this event is after normal hours, and all ID's will be checked at the door. Ms. Kllanxhja said security will be by the library security personnel. The outdoor area is only accessible through the community room and the outdoor area is completely fenced.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked how the intoxication of attendees will be monitored. Ms. Kllanxhja said that library staff and security will circulate and observe guests. Hearing Officer Grattan confirmed that this application was for two different dates. Ms. Kllanxhja confirmed this, May 1st, and November 6, 2015.

City Attorney Shaver said he would recommend approval and entered the Exhibits into the record.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone present who is in favor or against this request. Hearing Officer Grattan found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there were no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, and its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for special event permits submitted by Mesa County Public Library Foundation was in order and approved it.

5. The Kiwanis Club of Grand Junction, CO, P.O. Box 1377, Grand Junction, CO 81502 - Rose Hill Bike Rally on May 3, 2015 – 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., at 750 24 Road, Grand Junction, Malt and Vinous

LeAnn Zetmeir, event manager, was present.

Ms. Peterson reported the paperwork was in order and all reports are in compliance.

City Attorney Shaver handed Ms. Zetmeir three pages. The first two pages were marked with an "A" in the upper right hand corner and the next document with a "B" (see attached). City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Zetmeir if she is familiar with these documents. She answered yes, that she completed these documents. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Zetmeir whose signature that was on the second page of Exhibit A. She said it was hers. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Zetmeir to describe the event. Ms. Zetmeir said they have held this event for 19 years, but this is the first year they would have a beer/wine garden. The beer/wine garden will be secondary to the bike rally and completely fenced with orange webbed fencing. They are using this as a service project for the community and to raise funds for their organization. They will have two volunteers attend the City of Grand Junction Alcohol Seller/Server training on April 16th. Ms. Zetmeir said they will have two security guards on hand. ID's will be checked and wristbands will be given to those over 21 years of age.

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Peterson if the correct insurance was submitted with the additional insureds. Ms. Peterson said yes. City Attorney Shaver said he would recommend approval and entered the Exhibits into the record.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone present who is favor or against this request. Hearing Officer Grattan found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there were no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, and its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for a special event permit submitted by The Kiwanis Club of Grand Junction Colorado was in order and approved it.

6. Latin Anglo Alliance Foundation, Inc., PO Box 1734, Grand Junction, CO 81502 - Cinco de Mayo Celebration – 2015 on May 2, 2015 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. located on Main Street from east of the breezeway on 4th Street, north and south to alleys on 5th Street, and east on Main to 6th Street, Grand Junction CO, Malt and Vinous

Events Manager: Mike Archuleta, 667 Cordial Ct., Grand Junction, CO 81506

Mr. Jerry Martinez and Mr. Mike Archuleta were both present.

Hearing Officer Grattan said the reason that this item was moved to the end of the agenda was due to questions on the diagram and the memo from the Police Department.

Ms. Peterson reported that the paperwork was in order but the Police Department submitted a report from issues at last year's event. This was only given to the applicant two days ago along with the City Clerk's office.

Hearing Officer Grattan marked the Police Memo as Exhibit C (see attached) and entered it into the record.

City Attorney Shaver handed Mr. Archuleta three pages. The first two pages were marked with an "A" in the upper right hand corner and the next document with a "B" (see attached). City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Archuleta if he is familiar with these documents. He answered yes, that he and Mr. Martinez completed these documents. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Archuleta whose signature that was on the second page of Exhibit A. He said it was his. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Archuleta to describe the event.

Mr. Archuleta said this event has taken place for 34 years and the money made from the event is given out in scholarships. There are numerous events throughout the day and it concludes with a street dance. City Attorney Shaver asked if during those 34 years have there been any problems in the past. Mr. Archuleta said not to their knowledge. Up until two days ago they were not aware of any of these issues. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Archuleta to describe how this event is put on. Mr. Archuleta said that the tasks are broken up to different committee members within their organization. City Attorney Shaver asked about the general control. Mr. Archuleta said they have hired professional security which mans the exits, and they also have volunteers that help monitor the event throughout the day from their organization. They sell tickets for beer, if they have no wristband, they will not be served. City Attorney Shaver asked about the comment in the memorandum regarding 5-6 different types of wristbands. Mr. Archuleta said last year they got their wristbands from the beer distributor but they found out after the event started that they were not sticking. They purchased a different wristband which was pink, a different color. Mr. Martinez said after they read this memo, the only thing they could think of that would cause different types of wristbands was due to the numerous events taking place on that same day last year. There was another Cinco de Mayo event at Lincoln Park, there was an event in Palisade and possibly other events in the area since it was such a nice day. City Attorney Shaver asked them to look at the diagram marked with a "B" in the upper right hand corner. City Attorney Shaver made sure that it was the same diagram everyone was looking at marked in the bottom left hand corner with "Monday, April 6, 2015 09:16 AM". Mr. Archuleta said the description on the application and the diagram did not match so this was changed. The alcohol service area is outlined and labeled in blue. City Attorney Shaver said the yellow line shows the entire event. Mr. Archuleta said that is correct. City Attorney Shaver asked how they intend to keep the alcohol contained in the blue area. Mr. Archuleta said there will be metal fencing as a barrier with an opening along with a security person stationed at each of the openings which is mid-block between 4th and 5th

streets, across Main Street at 6th, also at both the alleys north and south on 5th Street.

City Attorney Shaver said on the questionnaire they indicate there will be 4-8 staggered security. City Attorney Shaver said from the memo the officers last year did not believe there was enough security at the event. It was also noted that there was only 6 security persons working the event.

Hearing Officer Grattan said with the numbers indicated and he has attended this event in the past, he agrees that he does feel that 4-8 is enough.

Mr. Archuleta said the number of persons attending varies due to the time of day, weather, etc. Mr. Archuleta said that the comment regarding the server stating she had no knowledge of the visibly intoxicated serving restriction, they use volunteers from their organization, and this year they will have a packet of training materials to give to each one. Mr. Archuleta said how they have monitored persons in the past is if they look like they have had too much to drink, they encourage them to just have a seat and listen to the music but are not served anything additional. He said they try and watch patrons coming from licensed establishments to their event to gauge for intoxication.

City Attorney Shaver asked about if they feel the 4-8 security persons are not enough, what they will do. Mr. Archuleta said they will contact Lonestar Security supervisor and Lonestar will deploy additional security to the area. Mr. Archuleta said they will provide vests with "security" marked on them for their volunteers so they will be more identifiable to those in attendance this year.

Hearing Officer Grattan said he wants Latin Anglo Alliance to continue to have a successful Cinco de Mayo event this year and into the future. Mr. Archuleta said that is also their goal. Hearing Officer Grattan asked if Mr. Archuleta would consider amending the questionnaire, item 7 to have staggered security up to 8 by 5:00 p.m. and into the evening and 4 volunteers with marked security vests in addition after 5:00 p.m. Both Mr. Archuleta and Mr. Martinez were in agreement.

Police Services Technician Ms. Meghan Woodland from the Grand Junction Police Department did comment on the memorandum and their department is working at getting this information out to the applicant right after the event, so it won't be a surprise in the future.

Hearing Officer Grattan said there is no one in the Hearing Room besides the applicants, so there would not be anyone else for or against this request, he found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there were no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, and its location within the community. He is satisfied that the applicant has addressed the issues from last year and will conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for a special event permit submitted by Latin Anglo Alliance for Cinco de Mayo was in order and approved it.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS

Ms. Peterson gave the Hearing Officer Grattan and City Attorney Shaver an update on the Colorado Mesa University dba Colorado Mesa University Downtown Art Gallery license. The State is requiring Mr. Foster, the President to be on this license. Hearing Officer Grattan is still not certain the University meets the qualifications of a “nonprofit arts organization” subject to the provisions of articles 121 to 137 of title 7, C.R.S. and held to be tax-exempt by the federal internal revenue service. Ms. Peterson will keep the Authority posted on this process.





Re: Latin Anglo Alliance Foundation, Inc – Cinco de Mayo Celebration – 05/03/14

This event was checked by multiple officers (on-foot) from 6pm-10pm. The following is a summary of the officers' report.

Barriers/Boundary: Boundary barriers appeared to be further than what was depicted in the special event permit application. IDs were not being checked at the barriers. The barriers were moved inward, leaving attractions still outside the boundary, which drew people out of the boundary with alcohol.

There were also reports of people taking alcohol out of the event. The Candy Store complained that people were bringing alcohol into their store. Stephanie Tuin also reported to the officers that she had observed people leaving the event with alcohol beverages (around 5th & Main)

Security: After checking with the Lonestar Manager, it was reported that there were only 5 guards and 1 supervisor working the event. This was clearly not enough people with 4 street entrances to maintain and two breezeways. The officers that reported suggested that with the size of the event and crowd, a 10 security guard team was easily needed. It was also reported by a complaining company (The Candy Store) that they had not seen security all day.

Signage: The Under 21 sign was posted, but was at the back of the tent, and hardly visible from the officer's stand point. The permit was later seen as well. Both signs were moved to a better location from the request of the officer.

Over Service: One of the officers saw a couple of patrons that were on the verge of being visibly intoxicated. The two main services were made aware of this. One of the servers the officer talked to stated she had no knowledge of the visibly intoxicated serving restriction, and did not have TIPS or City Liquor training. The officers did not see any extremely intoxicated people (or any apparent underage drinkers).

Misc: The beer tent was reported to be in the correct spot. IDs were being checked at a booth just N of the beer tent, and wristbands were issued. However, there were 5-6 different types of wristbands. There were no examples of which ones to look for at the beer tent; this makes the possibility of unauthorized wristbands making their way into the mix.

There was a potential fight between 10+ people in the area of 6th & Main. The officers defused the situation before security responded. This could have caused an issue had the officers not been there, and only 5 guards were there to assist.

** There was also an assault reported at Quincy Bar, where a male walking into the bar, punched a customer, causing a fight then they both left. It is UNKNOWN if there is any connection with this special event.
